On behalf of the Habitat Partnership Program and Colorado Parks and Wildlife, thank you for your interest in working with HPP.

In order to give your project full consideration, a completed application form is extremely helpful and may be required by your local HPP committee. There is a specific application for each type of project – just pick the one that fits your project. You will need to print out these forms and then fill in the sections by hand.

Please be concise but thorough and feel free to attach a map, pictures and anything else you think important to help the local HPP committee visualize the area and your project. By completing this form you will be able to present your project to the committee in a logical manner that directly identifies and addresses the concerns shared by its members.

I would encourage you to make contact with the local CPW District Wildlife Manager early in your planning process. Not only can they help you with project design and other ideas for an effective project but they can also provide insight into questions or concerns that the local committee may have as they consider your project.

Once you have completed a project application or simply wish to find out more about your local HPP committee, please look on the HPP web page for local contact information and how best to submit your proposal. Many committees prefer or require applicants to attend the meeting to explain their proposal, answer any questions that may arise and agree to any changes that might be requested. It would be to your advantage to attend the meeting that your project will be discussed at. Please make sure to talk to the CPW representative to get the meeting date, time and location.

Depending on committee procedures and questions, your project may be approved at the initial presentation or at a later date. If there is a time constraint or immediate need for the project, be sure to inform the committee of that.

Please note that projects over \$5000 require additional state approval before any work can begin.
