

Sylvan Lake State Park Management Plan



CPW is developing a **Management Plan for Sylvan Lake State Park**. Located approximately 10 miles southeast of the Town of Eagle, thousands of visitors come to Sylvan Lake for the beautiful mountain lake, stunning views, cabins, campsites, picnic areas, non-motorized water sports and excellent fishing. The park also offers a variety of winter and summer activities and environmental interpretive programs for all ages.

The park management planning process will consider whether infrastructure changes or new recreational facilities are needed to preserve high quality visitor experiences into the future while conserving the park's natural setting and wildlife habitat, important for a number of species.
