Project Description: The *Gunnison* Good OHV Management TRAIL Crew will develop, maintain and improve OHV trails, trailheads, parking and support facilities; reconstruct OHV trails and related facilities; produce, install and maintain signage for OHV trails and support facilities; develop, deliver and provide education and rider ethics training to the OHV riding community and Forest Service employees; maintain, supply and operate facilities owned by the USDA Forest Service that are used by OHV recreationalists; implement approved federal Travel Management Plans; and provide a field presence for visitor contacts, compliance and enforcement. Specifically, this work will take place on the Gunnison Ranger District, a 1.3 million unit on the Grand Mesa, Uncompanyer and Gunnison National Forest (GMUG NF). The Gunnison Ranger District encompasses parts of Gunnison, Hinsdale and Saguache Counties. Emphasis will be trail work accomplished on the ground. The Gunnison Ranger District prides itself in still being called a trail crew first. Even though various OHV's are used to accomplish and get to work, the emphasis is trail maintenance rather than riding OHV's.

WHO?

The USDA Forest Service, Gunnison Ranger District would be responsible for the project. The project is located on Public Lands managed by the Forest Service. It is planned that work will be accomplished by U.S. Forest Service force account trail crew personnel with possible help from partners such as Crested Butte Conservation Corp. (CBCC). Volunteers may also help accomplish the project.

The Gunnison Ranger District has been a member of the State's Good Management Program since the program's inception.

WHERE?

The project area is located on the Grand Mesa, Uncompander & Gunnison National Forest, Gunnison Ranger District within Gunnison, Hinsdale and Saguache Counties, Colorado. This area is in west central Colorado. The Gunnison Ranger District manages 1.3 million acres on both the Gunnison and Uncompander National Forests. Work will be accomplished during the summer and fall of 2025. Trail maintenance will occur on the Ranger District's motorized trail system.

WHAT?

The money received from the Good OHV Management Program (GMP) fund will support a four-person crew in five primary areas. First and as it's annual priority, it will support routine maintenance of the district's motorized trails (both light and heavy maintenance). Second, will be continued maintenance and follow-up monitoring of our recently reconstructed trails. (i.e. Timberline, 424 Doctor Park, etc.) The work of our Good Management and our stand-alone grant funded projects just mentioned have been instrumental in increasing or improving OHV riding opportunities and/or experiences in our area. The most recently completed stand-alone reconstruction grant would be the 424 Motorcycle Trail Reconstruction project. Third, the crew will help implement sign plans and check or monitor trail signing and travel management signing on motorized trails. Fourth, the crew leader and crew will continue to implement and improve the district's motorized user education program. The crew has and will continue to provide motorized user education in Taylor Park or other locations such as the Cement Creek or Pitkin areas on both the 4th of

July and Labor Day holiday weekends or in Taylor Park for the semi-annual Razor Rally in August. The Good Management Crew leader will also attend one of the Colorado 500 Charity Motorcycle Ride's breakfasts or dinners in August. Education Days will also occur near or during the primary fall big game hunting seasons. The crew will continue to work with Colorado Parks and Wildlife and the 'Stay the Trail' trailer on those weekends or when otherwise possible. The crew will participate in sound testing of OHV's alongside Colorado Parks and Wildlife staff members. Fifth, Training: The Good Management Trail Crew Leader and Trails Manager will both continue to teach an off-road motorcycle training to Forest Service and BLM employees. Supplies, materials and equipment are items that Good Management funding will also provide to implement work on the ground. (See budget). Also, the trail crew leader and at least one other trail crew member along with the District Trails Manager will perform Forest Protection Officer (FPO) duties when necessary or assigned. The emphasis for this crew is accomplishing trail work on the ground and being visible to the public when doing so. This will provide invaluable visibility to the value of Colorado Parks and Wildlife's OHV Trail Grant Program.

WHEN?

Work performed by the Gunnison OHV Good Management Trail Crew will occur from April 2025 into October of 2025. <u>Trail work</u> will be accomplished predominately May thru October. The Good Management Trail Crew leader will be performing pre-season work in April and post season work in November which includes hunter patrols and our annual Hunter Education days in the Gunnison, Crested Butte and Lake City areas.

Program Funding Acknowledgement:

If funding is awarded the Good Management Crew's work will be acknowledged in a number of ways. On a daily basis "Trail Work Ahead" signs will be placed above and below the working trail crews that will be working on the motorized trails on the Gunnison Ranger District. The signs include the blue and white Colorado Parks and Wildlife "Colorado OHV Registration Dollars at Work" sticker as part of the sign. The signs state that the project is being funded by the Colorado State OHV Registration Fund. Also, the sticker will be prominent on some of the equipment used by the Good Management trail crew such as the motorized power carriers that are used by our trail crews. The sticker is displayed on the recently purchased Polaris UTV used by the Gunnison Good Management Crew, "Dollars at Work" stickers are also prominently displayed by the Ranger District's other trail crew. The Good Management Program is also often mentioned or covered in the local newspapers. (See attached article) Lastly, credit to the Colorado Parks and Wildlife "OHV Registration Dollars at Work" is also featured at some of the Ranger District's informational kiosks and on recently reconstructed motorized trails such as Italian Connector Trail #648. The State's annual brochure covering funded projects would also acknowledge the project and the State OHV Grant Program.




