- BV River Park- Barbara Whipple Bridge (tourists)
  - improve safety signage and AHRA loaner station
  - Lots of public involvement/support

#### • AHRA Park Manager Updates

Tom Waters, AHRA Park Manager

- Salida Lowhead Dam
  - Construction has already started
  - Construction is predicted through the end of December, possibly January
  - A lot of what is left is beautification/plant restoration, which is the goal once the dam is removed
  - Lisa: determining max CFS for the project
  - Plan is to restore to natural gradient
- Scout Wave
  - Project 2.0 planned to fix the fish passage and structure itself
  - Construction is planned for January-February; Out of river by Mar 1, 2023
  - AHRA is expecting to see an updated drawing by Nov. 10
- Pocket Wave (BV)
  - We are holding off on the project for now (Fall 2024)

#### 2023-2024 CTF Meetings:

- Salida East Renovation
  - Work was finished this summer, and we have received good feedback about the improvements
  - We are attempting to get an acceleration/deceleration lane with CDOT
- Five Points Cleanup
  - o AHRA has made a request to the state for money, and we continue to ask
  - Temp staff cleaned up the campground over the Summer
    - They replaced tent pads, replaced a few fire rings, and did an overall cleanup
- Parkdale Boat Ramp
  - o Trying to finish up permitting with the Army Corps of Engineers
    - AHRA needs to get a wetland study first
  - The goal is to change the boat ramp to concrete to mitigate flooding
  - Talking to CDOT to widen the road for buses
  - Goal is Fall 2023
- River Station and Centennial Boat Ramps
  - Agreement with Canon has expired, we are hoping to renew
  - AHRA will continue to clean/pick up sites
  - City/AHRA/Feds are exploring options to accommodate public and commercial trips
- FLAP Ruby Mountain Entrance Road
  - o Fall 2024 is the plan
- Black Hills Property
  - Fix the Canon public/commercial problem
  - Negotiation with the City and Black Hills to make the area public access
  - Not much of an update at this point
- Park Manager II Positions
  - Welcome Serena Rocksund!
    - Taking Tappan's old position
  - We will welcome Jess King in January as the third PMII position at AHRA
  - Allegra (USFS) taking over for Dani Cook
- Recreation Rangers
  - Currently funded by BLM and Chaffee County
  - AHRA had four recreation rangers this year, three from local High School, one local adult with experience in connecting people to needed resources; USFS had three recreation rangers; BLM had one
- VFMP Wrap-Up
  - Successful season, we did not have to use 10,000 acre feet set aside
    - Due to projects from USBR and conditions of the season
  - Communication between stakeholders has been key
    - Stakeholders moved water at times that benefited the industry (especially Pueblo Water)
  - Late release of water got good response from both boaters and fishermen
  - When do water users anticipate moving winter water?
    - Evaluation of snowpack levels in February
    - March/April water move (after Elbert power plant back online)
- Walk/Wade Private Property
  - Do not need to report W&W on private property ARK River Act

- Signage of private property boundaries is the responsibility of the land owner
- Access to SWA/easements is from parking lot/designated shore
- Visitation
  - Do not have October visitation numbers yet
  - 1.2 million visitors at this point
- AHRA Rationing and Permit Updates John Kreski, AHRA Rationing & Permits
  - Private Boat Counts
    - John presented the 2023 private boat counts.
    - These will be posted online after being finalized (end of year 2023).

## • BLM Updates

Kalem Lenard, BLM RGFO Asst Field Mgr

- Changes in staffing:
  - Trying to get "career" seasonals
  - Two people are to join in March (one OHV and one general park ranger)
  - Third person is funded by the Chaffee Commission/Common Ground
- BLM estimates that about 33 tons of trash were cleaned up from dispersed sites
- Worked on Brown's Grotto, only boulder work is left
- Mt. Shavano is the next proposed site to receive work to make designated sites (about 80 are predicted at this point)
- Keith Berger retiring in late May; working on the announcement to back-fill
- Visitation: End of September FYE; up slightly from 2019, down from 2022.
- USFS Updates Perry Edwards
  - Currently working on dispersed camping management plan
    - Numbers long-term developed camping planned
      - downstream along the edge of river-right (land-swap for river left) or change the agreement with USFS w/ seasonal closure for wildlife
      - number of campsites not yet determined
      - Patrick Mercer Leadville RD
  - USFS is working on filling vacant positions
  - Porter Gulch
    - The decision to re-route Porter Gulch trail was signed last Friday

- Working with Fremont County R&B to re-route
- No trailers or camping
- Monarch Park Campground
  - Currently in the final process of finishing up the project
  - Goal is to dredge two ponds
  - Add an ADA pier
  - Spring/Summer completion
  - Re-vegetation will happen after
