Colorado Tallgrass Prairie State Natural Area



- Owner: City of Boulder Open Space & Mountain Parks
- Originally designated in 1984; 269 acres
- Amended designation in 2023; expansion to 1347 acres

Description of Natural Features: The Colorado Tallgrass Prairie is a remnant of a onceextensive area of tallgrass prairie occupying the entire South Boulder Creek floodplain and much of the ancient glacial outwash surfaces that dot parts of the Front Range. High-quality examples of both xeric and mesic tallgrass prairie community remnants contain habitat for a multitude of species of greatest conservation need including bobolink, grasshopper sparrow, golden eagle, burrowing owl, northern leopard frog, Preble's meadow jumping mouse, Ottoe skipper, regal fritillary, and Ute ladies'tresses. Additional rare plant species include prairie violet, slimleaf milkweed, and dwarf leadplant.
