

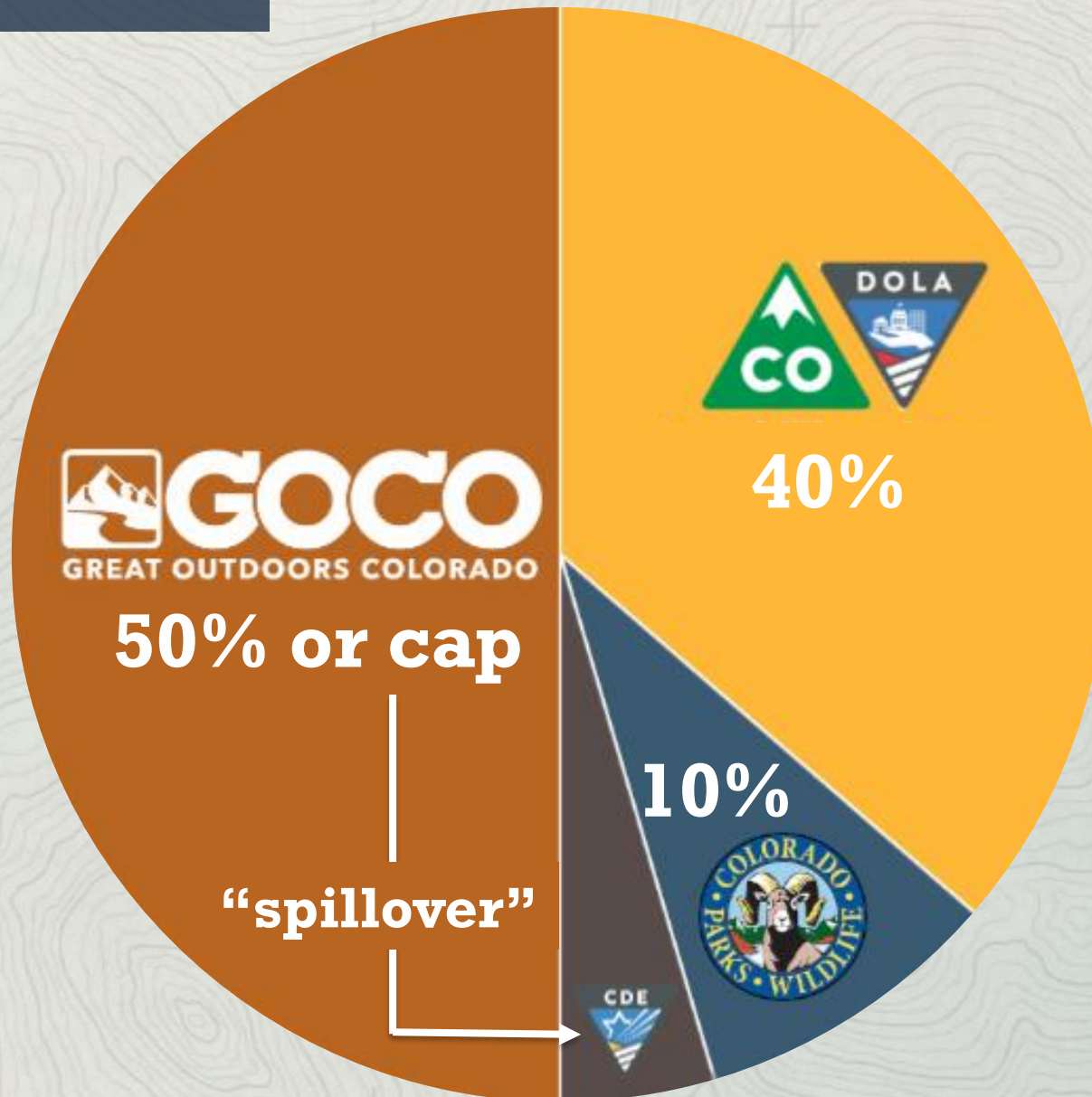
GOCO Overview

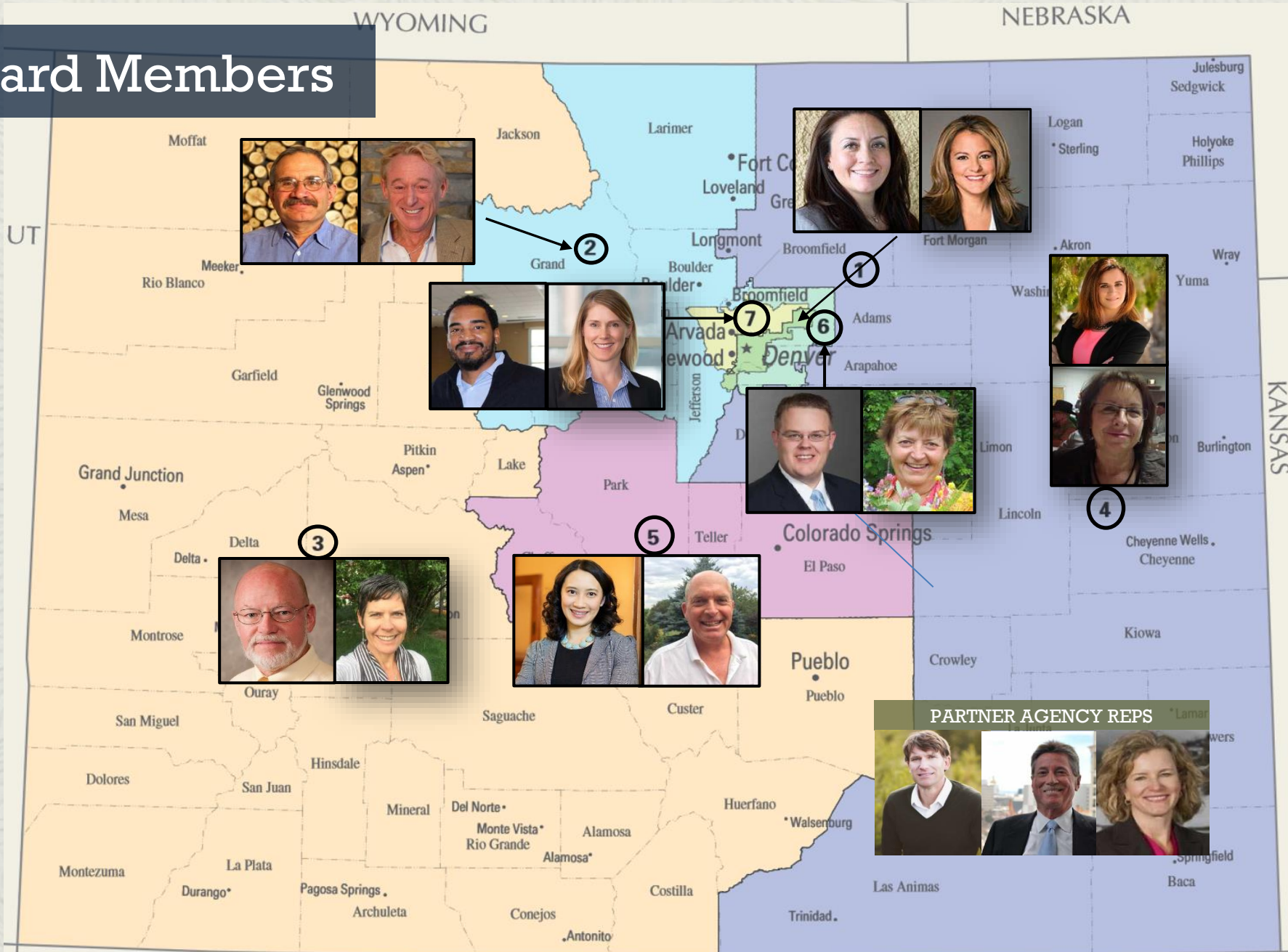

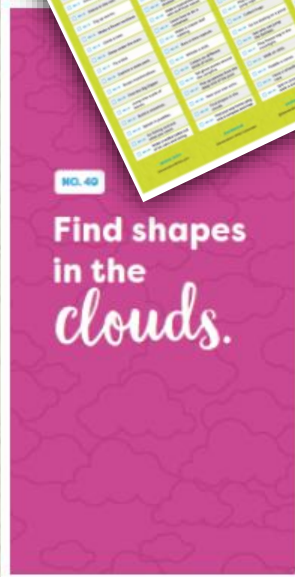
