Opportunities for landowners to voluntarily protect important wildlife habitat, provide wildlife-related recreational access to the public, and, if appropriate, sell their property to CPW.

Landowners (or third party sponsors) may apply for funding through the Request for Proposals (RFP) process per Title 33-1-105 CRS.

*Public access for hunting, fishing, wildlife viewing

*Big game winter range and migration corridors

*Protecting habitat for species of concern (specifically those

Species of Greatest Conservation Need, as identified in the SWAP)

*Riparian areas and wetlands

*Landscape-scale parcels

*Parcels that provide connectivity

2022 Recommended Preferences:

*Working farms and ranches
*Conservation Easements that support wildlife crossings

Funding Sources

*CPW

- -Revenue generated from the sale of Habitat Stamps
- -Revenue generated from the sale of hunting & fishing licenses "wildlife cash"

*GOCO (through Cooperative Agreement)

- -Wildlife Quadrant Dollars
- -Not from GOCO's other funding programs

*Federal funding sources (rarely)

2022 RFP Timeline

June 13, 2022: RFP opens - materials posted to CPW website Oct 13: Proposal Deadline 5pm Oct - Feb 2023: CPW staff & HSC review, score, rank proposals

January, 2023: Commission update: proposals & program

February: Leadership creates recommendations for Commission

March: Commission votes on first round of proposals

April: Additional staff review; Director meets w/ Leadership,

final recommendations formed

May: Commission's final review of projects

May/June: CPW staff begins negotiations, due diligence
