General Overview of BGSS Process



- BGSS guides annual big game hunting regulations.
- Sets the timing, length, and number of seasons for hunting big game in Colorado.
- CPW's BGSS framework covers 5 years.
 - *Current BGSS expires at the end of* **2024**.



Big Game Attitude Survey

~2,200 respondents (evenly split between residents/nonresidents)

 Random sample survey; asked hunters about various big game hunting season structures/preferences

Helped to inform the selection of BGSS topics for the 2025-2029 BGSS cycle

Primary Topics for the 2025-2029 BGSS






1. **Over-the-counter** archery/rifle elk limitation

- 2. **Season structure** (dates and timing) for regular deer/elk rifle seasons <u>and</u> early seasons
- 3. **Additional seasons** (optional deer in first rifle/optional second pronghorn rifle)








OTC Limitation - Public Input


Key Findings/Takeaways

- Majority of residents prefer some form of OTC limitation rather than status quo; many want OTC elk licenses (archery AND rifle) for residents only.
- Nonresidents prefer status quo.





Debate over limiting OTC through a **cap** or through the **draw**.

Season Structure for Regular Deer/Elk Rifle Seasons - Public Input

Key Findings/Takeaways

- **General satisfaction** with current BGSS dates (various benefits)
- But wide variety of opinions → numerous ideas for how to adjust
- Main concerns: overlap with Thanksgiving Holiday; hunting too late (vulnerable animals and snow closures)

Season Structure for Early Seasons (Archery/Muzzleloader) - Public Input

Key Findings/Takeaways

• General satisfaction with current BGSS dates

- Requests to remove overlap between seasons to reduce crowding/increase opportunity
- Various other suggestions to improve seasons

Addition of First Rifle Deer Season -Public Input





Key Findings/Takeaways

- **General opposition** from the public across all regions
- Concern with potential **overlap** with elk rifle seasons
- **Biological concerns** for deer herds
- Sportsperson's Roundtable was **generally supportive**

Addition of Second Pronghorn Season -Public Input

Key Findings/Takeaways

- General support (or ambivalence)
- Could help **reduce crowding/hunting pressure** on opening day/first weekend
- Some nonsupport due to concerns over hunting too late already and lack of need for additional season





Extension of BGSS Cycle - Public Input

Maintain Status Quo at 5 years

VERSUS

Lengthen to 7 or 10 years

Key Findings/Takeaways

 Majority of respondents prefer maintaining 5-year BGSS to allow for more flexibility and adaptability
