


## Colorado Natural Areas Program

- ► Elevate and highlight marginalized communities- including Black, Indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC), LGBTQIA2S+ communities, and Adaptive climbers.








# Thank you to the 125<sup>th</sup> Bill Pickett Rodeo at the National Western Stock Show!

### Wildlife and Habitat Roundtable Meeting

December 2022



The Colorado Wildlife Habitat Program (CWHP) is a statewide program that supports Colorado Parks and Wildlife's (CPW) mission by offering funding opportunities for landowners who wish to voluntarily protect important wildlife habitat, and/or provide sustainable wildlife-related recreational access to the public.

The CWHP is an incentive-based, voluntary program that utilizes conservation easements, public access easements and, in some circumstances, fee title purchases to accomplish strategic wildlife conservation and public access goals.

The CWHP achieves multiple goals tied to the CPW Strategic Plan as well as the State Wildlife Action Plan:

- Build collaborative conservation partnerships that enhance the capacity to deliver CPW's mission.
- Conserve wildlife and habitat to ensure healthy sustainable populations and ecosystems.
- Increase awareness and trust for CPW.
- ► Connect people to Colorado's outdoors.

Visit to Cheyenne Mountain State Park

- Cheyenne Mountain State Park is a Colorado state park that was acquired in June 2000 through a partnership between the City of Colorado Springs, Colorado State Parks, Great Outdoors Colorado, Colorado Lottery, El Paso County, and other local private organizations.
- The campground is open year round\*
  - ▶ 51 full service campsites
  - 10 basic walk-in tent sites
  - \*early March to late October, the Camper Services building offers coin operated showers, laundry, a playground and activity room
  - Swift Puma and Gobbler Grove campground areas will be closed starting November 1, 2022 at noon and will reopen March 1, 2023
- Archery Range youth, standard, 3D
- Online Camp Reservation System though beneficial, a 2022 University of Montana study for lack of equity in federal park reservation websites. Disparities identified included low-wealth/income people/families unable to plan 6 months in advance do to vacation scheduling limitations and racially/ethnically diverse people with limited broadband, high speed internet. Rice said they got the cellphone data for over 3,000 users and looked at five campgrounds across the country, including sites in Colorado, Utah and Oklahoma.
