ISSUE: Should the Timed Entry Reservation System implemented at Eldorado Canyon State Park be extended for 2024? DISCUSSION (FACTS AND FIGURES, EXPLANATION OF ISSUE):

The Timed Entry Reservation System pilot ran last year from July 23 - Sept 15 for 2022. The initial results from the reservation system had positive results in reducing the crowding at the entrance and parking areas. The reservation system will run again this year from May 15 – Sept 15 for 2023. Park staff would like to extend the pilot one more year from May 15- Sept 15, 2024. This will allow Park staff to evaluate the effectiveness of the Timed Entry Reservation System at the conclusion of the 2023 season, then evaluate it again at the conclusion of the 2024 season.

Education and awareness of the Timed Entry Reservation System will continue with signage at the park, on social media, through contacts with visitors at the park, partnering agencies, and through local and regional newsprint and media outlets.

The Timed Entry Reservation System extension will continue to follow the currently approved regulation as stated in #100-D.10.d.

During the period beginning on July 1May 15, 20223 and continuing through September 15, 20223 and then beginning on May 15, 20234 and continuing through September 15, 20234, on every Saturday, Sunday and federal or state holiday, no motorized vehicle shall enter, park or use any facilities of Eldorado Canyon State Park from 5:30 am until 5:30 pm unless such use is by the authority of a valid day use reservation issued through the approved reservation system by Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

2. No change in current regulations.

County, Col public since	-acre Fishers Peak State Park (FPSP) is located south of the City of Trinidad in Las Animas lorado, and is one of CPW's newest state parks. Because FPSP has been open to the cCPW's first year of ownership, and because the park will offer evolving public access and ortunities as the park is developed, ongoing updates to park regulations will be necessary.			
October of 2 master plan portion of th anticipate a	specific regulations were established in 2020, prior to the park's limited public opening in 2020, and reflected the regulations necessary for the park at that time. Since 2020, the park in has been completed and an additional eleven (11) miles of trail have been constructed. A nese newly-constructed trails allow for mountain bike use. Before the end of 2023, we additional trail construction to be completed to allow access to the peak itself (Fishers Peak) w limited back-country camping in designated sites.			
The regulation changes proposed below are necessary for CPW to safely manage new activities at FPSP, including 24-hour access for camping, permitted biking on designated trails, the park's high wildfire risk, and protection of visitors and the peak's rare and endangered plant species once access to Fishers Peak is granted.
