➤ CPW received a total of 2,819 completed comment forms and 214 short-form responses from members of the public.





Comment Form Results - Question 1


68.7% of respondents identified as Colorado residents, while 31.3% percent identified as nonresidents.

"How would you describe your opposition or support for a preference point banking system where hunters use only that portion of their preference points needed plus 2-3 additional points to draw for deer, elk, pronghorn, and bear, and retain their remaining accumulated points?"








Comment Form Results - Question 3

(The current elk, deer, pronghorn, and bear draws assign the group the number of points the applicant with the fewest points applied with.)"







Comment Form Results - Question 4 Percentage of respondents ranking an alternative as first or second choice

Recommendation



Maintain status quo (i.e., do not implement preference point banking or group averaging)



Rationales for Recommendation- Banking

- 1. Public comment form results
- 2. 2022 Big Game Attitudes Survey results
- 3. Increasing complexity of hunting regulations
- 4. Potential for point creep
- 5. Online system logistics

Rationales for Recommendation- Group Averaging

- 1. Public comment form results
- 2. Does not address point creep
- 3. Unregulated commercialization of preference points
- 4. Unforeseen loopholes
- 5. Online system logistics

Staff Recommendation - License Allocation

Recommendation



Transition from the current license allocation system to a simpler 75/25 (R/NR) across-the-board allocation for deer, elk, pronghorn and bear

Rationales for Recommendation- 75:25 single allocation

- 1. Top issue for resident hunters
 - a. Public outreach results split by residency
- 2. Resident preference for more substantial increase in net license allocation than the status quo
- 3. Higher level of predictability
- 4. Simplifies CPW operations and regulations
- 5. Increases customer understanding



Commission Discussion

Request for Guidance: To implement any of these changes for the 2024 season, the Division requests that the Commission give strong guidance on the direction they are heading today and take final regulatory action in May 2023.

Preference Point Banking: Staff Alternative

➤ Implement a <u>simple</u> point banking system.

> Stipulating a <u>minimum number of points to be used</u> <u>per license drawn</u> could reduce the impact banking would have on the lower-point hunt codes.

➤ 2 to 3 point penalty for using banked points to draw a license



Group Applications: Possible Alternatives

➤ Improve a group applicants chance of drawing instead by:

 Having each applicant go through the drawing independently, using their own preference points, applicable allocation, and preference.

If not all draw, still none draw.
