History/Background

- State Wildlife Areas (SWA) are areas purchased with money from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses and equipment and federal funds
- SWAs are purchased
 - To conserve wildlife and wildlife habitat
 - To provide wildlife related recreation
 - When not in conflict the first two allow for other forms of recreation
- SWAs were reviewed for types of recreation they could sustain



General Provisions



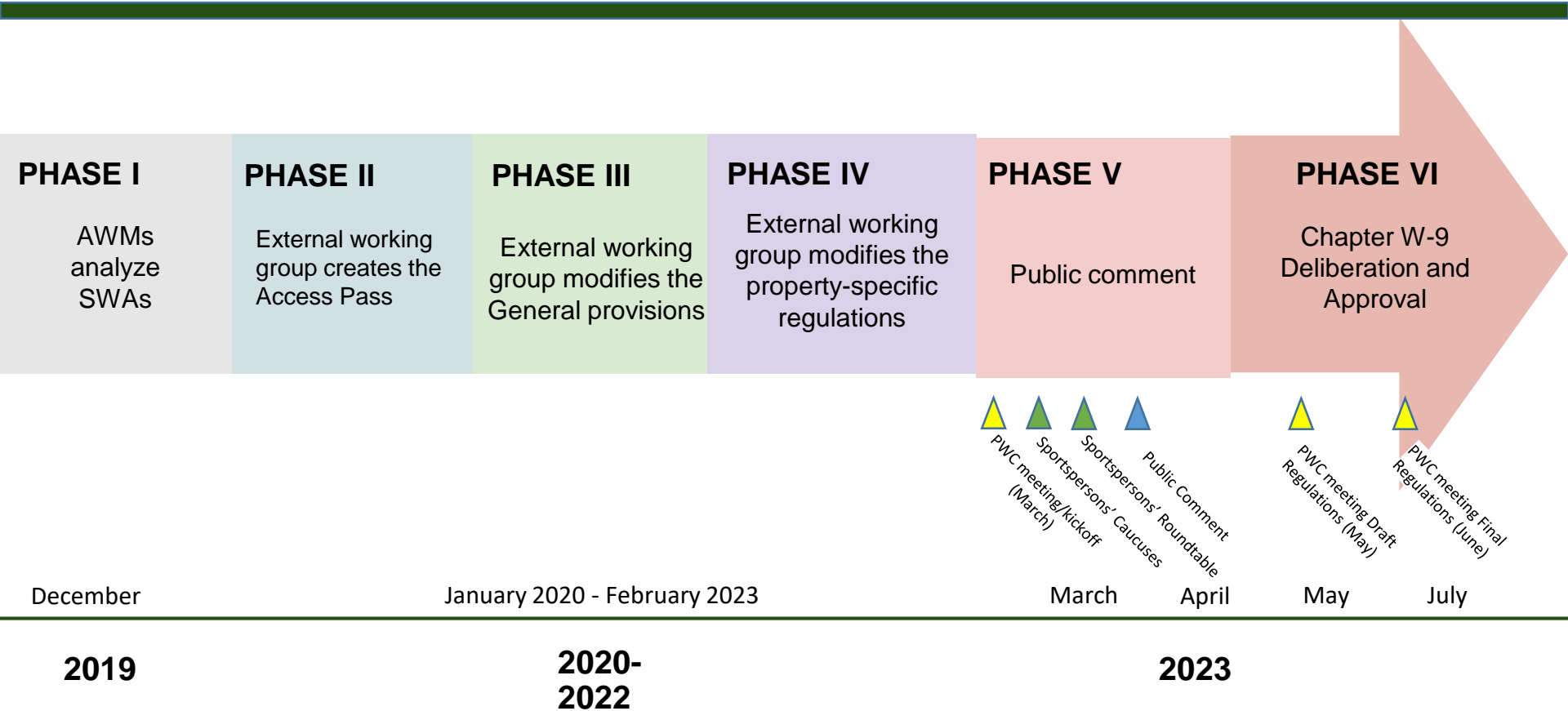
- SWA working group only focused on definitions and prohibited activities
- Significant changes include
 - Vessel definition and use
 - Vehicle definition and use
 - Recreational camping and fires
 - Dogs
 - Water contact activities
 - Drones and aircraft

Property Specific Provisions

- Actual management of specific properties across Colorado has been kept relatively consistent
- Moving toward more standardized wording
- May make further prohibitions but may also make allowances for recreation that is prohibited by general provisions
