





Unlimited OTC Rifle Elk License Sales by Residency 2001-2023






Unlimited OTC Archery, OTC 2nd Rifle, and OTC 3rd Rifle Elk License Sales 2001-2023

OTC Rifle Elk Licenses

Staff Recommendation: Alternative 1: Status quo


- Declining trend in OTC participation / rifle sales
- Crowding less of a concern than archery
- No biological concerns with maintaining OTC rifle
- Substantially less public engagement for OTC rifle compared to archery
- Fiduciary Impacts Potentially Severe












Financial Impacts of Archery OTC Limitation Alternatives Elk Licenses plus Qualifying Licenses

OTC Archery Elk Licenses

Staff Recommendation:

Alternative 2 - Resident and nonresident archery elk licenses are limited and issued via the draw; Unlimited OTC archery licenses available for residents only (statewide scale)

- Increasing trend in OTC archery participation / license sales
- Crowding a concern; likely higher than during 2nd and 3rd rifle seasons
- Substantial public engagement (10+ years)
- Incremental move towards limitation without going fully limited
- Fiduciary impacts can be absorbed
- CPW responded to resident hunters importance of OTC, hunting heritage
