# HB 23-1036 (Nontoxic Bullet Replacement Hunting Program) Update



### What is HB 23-1036?

- Mandates CPW to work with NGOs to establish a pilot program that encourages or incentivizes the use of non-lead ammunition while hunting and report on the results of the program.
- Other tasks include promoting the use of non-lead ammunition through informational materials and holding range demonstrations to promote the efficacy of non-lead ammunition.
- The NGOs we have been coordinating with include The National Wildlife Federation, North American Non-lead Partnership, Sporting Lead-Free, and American Bird Conservancy.

#### Nontoxic Bullet Replacement Hunting Program



**BILL SUMMARY** 

The act creates the nontoxic bullet pilot program (pilot program), which allows individuals who meet the qualifications to receive vouchers that offset the cost of purchasing hunting rounds that have nonlead bullets. The pilot program will focus on areas where the exposure of wildlife populations to spent lead bullets is of special or potential concern. The division of parks and wildlife (division) will work with one or more willing nongovernmental entities to determine the scope and collect the results of the pilot program. The division may work with nongovernmental entities to develop educational materials and range demonstrations relating to the pilot program.

## **Task 1: Information Sharing**

- Updated the "Get the Lead Out"
  language in our sheep/goat/moose and
  big game brochures by adding:
  - detail on wildlife health impacts (specifically for nontarget wildlife) from lead ammunition
  - suggestions for how to reduce human and wildlife health related impacts from lead when hunting
  - a link to Sporting Lead-Free's website for additional information on the wildlife impacts of using lead while hunting.
- We also plan to roll out a **webpage** in summer 2024 with links to information, video/photo footage of the range demos, and an overview of the pilot program.

## Task 2: Range Demonstrations


CPW will host a series of range demonstrations to showcase the efficacy and ballistics of nonlead ammunition to hunters and the public.

**Day 2:** Public will be invited to will attend classroom session and range demonstration.




### **Task 3: Pilot Program**

#### **Proposed Approach:**

- 1) CPW will target a subset of hunters who successfully draw deer and elk rifle licenses with educational materials to inform them of the benefits of using non-lead ammunition while hunting and provide information and resources on where to purchase non-lead ammunition.
- 2) Information will also be provided on how hunters who choose to hunt with lead ammunition might still **reduce the risk to non-target wildlife** (i.e., by removing gut piles, etc.).
- 3) After the hunting seasons conclude, CPW will **survey hunters to determine whether they used non-lead ammunition** in the field or took other measures, the rationales for their choice, and their experience.
- 4) CPW will use this information to **prepare a report** for the Parks and Wildlife Commission and the public.
