

PASS AND TOUCH



How well do you know nature? This activity will test your nature I.Q., and your memory, as you try to identify various objects from nature without being able to see them.

Materials

- At least six different nature objects such as a rock, leaf, stick, shell, pinecone, etc. (Multiple rocks, leaves, etc. can be used as long as they are noticeably different)
- Paper and pencil for each participant



Instructions

1. Have all participants form a circle with hands behind their back, eyes closed and facing outward.
2. Give the first nature object (rock, leaf, stick) to each player. The player tries to identify the object by feel, but they do not have to reveal the answer.
3. The object is then passed from hand to hand around the circle, giving each player a chance to identify it.
4. After all of the items have been passed, lay them out on a table and put different letters next to each object so they can be identified by that letter.

Finally, have each participant write down the order in which they think the items were passed around the group. The participant who guesses the order correctly, or whoever is closest to the correct order, is the winner.
