

ELK SPRINGS RANCH

Hunting Rules

1. There will be one access to the ranch from which each hunting area can be reached.
2. All hunters must check in at a central check-in point one hour before sunrise each Hunting day (Check-in point is between milepost 42 and 43 on the South side of Highway 40, see Elk Springs map). **IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR YOUR SAFETY, ALL HUNTERS MUST CHECK OUT AT THE SAME CHECK IN POINT AT THE END OF EACH HUNTING DAY.** The check-in point will be staffed one hour before sunrise and one hour after sunset. Each public hunter will be given lock combinations for any locked gates in the hunting areas.
3. Motor vehicles will be allowed access on the property, but travel will be restricted to existing roads as shown on topography maps received at check-in. Certain Areas may be designated as walk-in areas only. And they will be clearly posted. No ATVs or snowmobiles will be allowed on the property.
4. Each licensed hunter is allowed to carry one gun while hunting on the property.
5. Licensed hunters will be limited to one non-hunting guest while on the Ranch property. The one non-hunting guest must remain the same during the length of your hunt. The one non-hunting guest cannot hold a regular Colorado hunting license for the same time frame as your hunt.
6. Areas around dwellings and livestock handling facilities will be closed to hunting for the safety of residents or employees.
7. No overnight use of the Ranch will be allowed.
8. No fires will be allowed. No littering will be allowed.
9. No sighting in or target shooting will be allowed.
10. All hunters will be asked to sign a release of liability form. The form also serves as a permit to be on the property, and will be kept in the possession of the hunter while hunting on the Ranch.
11. After you have harvested your animal you are asked to leave the property and not enter the property again.
12. Hunter is responsible for retrieval of game.
13. An additional cow tag will be offered to each elk hunter in 2021.
