Position Summary:

The Volunteer Instructor is a vital component of the Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) Hunter Education Program. The quality of each student's hunter education experience depends directly on the quality of the course he or she attends, which is ultimately defined by the quality of the instructor and their instruction. To ensure the best possible hunter education instruction, CPW requires certain qualifications and training for its Volunteer Hunter Education Instructors. To begin the process of becoming a Hunter Education Instructor, an application must be filled out and submitted to the CPW Hunter Education Program.

Qualification of Volunteer:

- Adult, 18 Or Older.
- Must have Hunter Education Certificate (card).
- Complete instructor application, background check and interview.

Time Commitment:

Volunteer instructors are expected to volunteer a minimum of 10 hours each year in the Hunter Education Program. Traditional Hunter Ed classes require a minimum of 10 hrs in the classroom, plus the written exam and live fire. Internet Conclusion Courses require a minimum of 4 hrs of hands-on firearm safety activities, Colorado laws and regulations, plus the written exam and live fire.

Requirements:

- Attend New Instructor Academy.
- Volunteer a minimum of 10 hours in the Hunter Education Program each year.
- Attend one continuing education workshop every three years.
- Represent and support the mission of CPW professionally and responsibly.

Benefits:

- Assist/mentor new hunters into the hunting heritage.
- Support and network with other Hunter Education Instructors.
- Incentives for participation.
- Supplemental insurance coverage while volunteering.
