#### **Position Summary:**

The Volunteer Instructor is a vital component of the Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) Hunter Education Program. The quality of each student's hunter education experience depends directly on the quality of the course they attend, which is ultimately defined by the quality of the instructor and their instruction. To ensure the best possible hunter education instruction, CPW requires certain qualifications and training for its Volunteer Hunter Education Instructors. To begin the process of becoming a Hunter Education Instructor, an application must be filled out and submitted to the CPW Hunter Education Program.

# **Volunteer Requirements:**

- Adult, 18 or Older.
- Must have Hunter Education Certificate (card).
- Complete instructor application, background check and interview.

#### **Time Commitment:**

Volunteer instructors are expected to volunteer a minimum of 10 hours each year in the Hunter Education Program. Traditional Hunter Ed classes require a minimum of 10 hours in the classroom, plus the written exam and live fire. Internet Conclusion Courses require a minimum of 4 hours of hands-on firearm safety activities, Colorado laws and regulations, plus the written exam and live fire.

### **Requirements:**

- Attend a New Instructor Academy, which is a weekend-long training typically held twice a year.
- Volunteer a minimum of 10 hours in the Hunter Education Program each year.
- Attend one continuing education workshop every three years.
- Represent and support the mission of CPW professionally and responsibly.

#### **Benefits:**

- The opportunity to assist and mentor new hunters.
- Support and network with other Hunter Education Instructors.
- Attend professionally led continuing education opportunities.

# Hunter Education Instructor Application and Information

# **Prerequisites:**

- 1. Must be 18 years of age or older (must be 21 to advance to the Instructor Level).
- 2. Must have successfully completed a **Hunter Education course** (regardless of age). **PLEASE NOTE:** Applicants will not be accepted until course is complete and confirmation is received.
- 3. Must have hunting experience.
- 4. Must have an e-mail address and phone number.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife will strive to recruit the most qualified instructors available. Our goal is to educate hunters to be safe, ethical, and legal. Further, we will strive to inform all interested students of the role of regulated hunting and wildlife management in the creation of a quality outdoor recreation experience. Volunteering to be a hunter education instructor is not a typical volunteer role. It takes a fair amount of time and commitment. Every instructor accepts responsibility for all volunteer agreements as listed in the Instructor Handbook. Please also understand that Hunter Education policies can change on a regular basis.

# **Application Process:**

- 1. Prospective instructor completes application form and forwards to Hunter Education (HE) office.
- 2. The HE office will check prerequisites and conduct a criminal background check. (Applicant may be denied certification on the basis of this check.)
- 3. Applicant will be interviewed. This is mainly to explain the program and to see if the applicant is a good fit for the Hunter Education program. A recommendation will be submitted to the HE Administrator.
- 4. If accepted into the program, applicant (now referred to as Apprentice or Trainee) will be directed to a local volunteer Instructor or District Wildlife Manager (DWM) to complete the student teaching portion of the training. An electronic Instructor Handbook will be sent to the apprentice/trainee. More information about trainee promotion requirements can be found in the Position Description above.
