Colorado Parks and Wildlife offers a free Lifetime Fishing License to individuals who are **totally and permanently** disabled. The Attorney General defines a total and permanent disability as “any physical or mental impairment which prevents substantial gainful employment, but only if it is reasonably certain that such a disability will continue throughout the lifetime of the disabled person”.

How to qualify for the Lifetime Fishing license:

1. **Be a Colorado Resident:** “Resident” means a person who has lived in Colorado for at least 6 consecutive months immediately before the date of application, has a **Colorado driver’s license or state ID**, and has the intent of making Colorado their permanent home.
2. **Provide proof of a total and permanent disability** (only *one* of the three types of documentation is needed):
 - a. A photocopy of Social Security Administration disability benefit documentation that shows an **ENTITLEMENT DATE** of seven years or longer.
 - i. Examples: BPQY form, TPQY form, Notice of Award letter that states “ You are entitled to monthly disability benefits beginning [Month, Year]”
 - b. A signed physician’s letter, **on their letterhead or prescription pad**, that states a total and permanent disability (as defined below). *Please note: the statement must specifically use the words “total” and “permanent”.*
 - i. Example: “[Patient] is totally and permanently disabled”
 - c. A photocopy from Division of Workers’ Compensation “Final Admission of Liability” form indicating permanent and total disability

Without proper documentation, we are unable to process your application. Fill out the application *completely*; any missing information will delay processing. Applications are accepted by email (disability.apps@state.co.us) or by mail (walk-in also accepted at this address):
