#### **PROJECT SELECTION CRITERIA**

### **Needs and Urgency of the Project (40 points):**

A. Describe the need for this project.

With funding from this grant, the Uncompander Valley Trail Riders will be able to continue to be a reliable group for our partners and local government organizations. We Will be able to bring our 2006 BR 350 back up to manufacturers Specs. Level Two Service with Tiller Repair will extend the number of years we will be able to keep this machine in our fleet. This 2006 BR 350 is used for the majority (61 miles) of our 95 total groomed miles on the Uncompander Plateau. The last thing we want is to have a broke down machine in the middle of the winter season endangering an operator and a hazard for the people that use the trails. Doing the Level Two Maintenance now is the best way to move forward as the machine can easily be accessed, and service done without the extremes of the cold weather and a bad working location. It is our goal to do as much as possible to our equipment ensuring that we have a safe and reliable groomer when it is needed most.

B. What is the importance of this project to your grooming program, the Colorado Snowmobile Program and your local community?

For Over 22 years the Uncompander Valley Trail Riders have been dedicated to providing 95 miles of safe, marked, snowmobile trails on the Uncompander Plateau, Owl Creek Pass and the Little Cimarron Areas. UVTR works in conjunction with Montrose County, Gunnison County, The Forest Service, and Colorado Parks and Recreation to Provide Winter Enthusiasts with safe and varied terrain. This Creates a large draw for the local businesses by attracting Enthusiasts who buy parts, fuel, food, Local Accommodations, with many other goods and services. Our trail system also supports the Colorado Snowmobile Program with Registration fees from visitors who use the trails.

C. Why is it important to undertake this project now instead of at a later time? Please describe any elements that make this project urgent or time sensitive?

The sooner we undertake the project the sooner we will be able to get our equipment repaired and ready for next year. If we can do the repair and service this summer, we will be guaranteed our groomer will be ready to operate this winter. As time goes on the repair shops have a tendency to take care of bigger customers (ski areas) first and put us off to the last minute, putting us in a time crunch later in the season when the snow flies.

D. What is the impact on the Statewide Snowmobile Program if this project does not get funded?

The Uncompanded Valley Trail riders have brought together all aspects of the community to establish and maintain a dedicated trail system to the Uncompanded Plateau, Owl Creek Pass, and the Little Cimarron areas. UVTR has worked hard to maintain the trails in both the summer and winter for all users. Recreation opportunities are growing state-wide, and we wish to do our part to continue to advance this growth in our area. This process has taken many years to establish and become successful with hard work and dedication from local agencies and our club. The Uncompanded Valley trail Riders have been a working club for over 22 years. If the project is not funded the 2006 Prinoth BR 350 will not be serviced to manufactures requirements shortening its life as part of our grooming program putting us in the position of possible replacement sooner rather than later. It is our goal to take care of and maintain our Prinoth Groomer the best way possible and be proactive in our efforts.

### Benefits (30 points):

A. What benefits will this project provide to the community and the Colorado Snowmobile Program?

More and more our state is growing with motorized recreation. We are as is well known as a hidden jewel in the motorized world for world class Skiing, ATVing, Mountain Biking, Motorcycling, Boating, Rafting, Dog Sledding, fishing and numerous other Summer and Winter activities. Therefore, snowmobiling is seen as an especially important part of our economy. We as a club provide a safe and effective trail system for all winter enthusiasts. This maintenance and upkeep on our equipment will ensure we provide a safe and quality groomed trail network for the public to enjoy for at least another nine to ten years. The Uncompander Valley Trail Riders are dedicated to maintaining the trail systems in the Owl Creek, Uncompander Plateau and Little Cimarron Areas for years to come.

B. How does your grooming program protect and improve winter trail opportunities?

The UVTR provides a well-marked, well-groomed and accessible trail system for winter enthusiasts of all levels and abilities. We need to be able to continue to maintain and groom these trails for MULTIPLE USERS by keeping our equipment updated. It will be critical to continue to mark and clear trails to improve the trail system. This is all volunteer work provided by the club members.

C. What is unique about your trail system?

Part of our trail system provides access to the Owl Creek Pass Area, Access to this area allows recreations to enjoy the high-country views of the San Juan Mountains and the Uncompangre Plateau that were the backdrop for the movie True Grit which stared John Wayne and Glen Campbell. The Uncompangre Plateau trail system lets you see all the way to the La Sal Mountains in Utah. Special sections of the plateau are part of the new Rim Rocker Trail System connecting Montrose with Moab Utah via mountain trails and roads. Our trail system offers access to 2000 square miles of terrain on the Uncompangre Plateau and over 1000 square miles of terrain in the Little Cimarron, Big Cimarron, Owl Creek Pass areas for these winter activities.

D. What types and skill level of trail users does your trail system attract?

There are all types of terrain for all level riders. We have well-groomed roads, Single track trails, open powder parks and high mountain park access. There are miles of state trails and open powder parks for every skill level. Our trail system offers a marked, groomed, and accessible trail system for all enthusiasts of all levels and abilities. We are able to continue to maintain and groom these trails for MULTIPLE USERS by keeping our equipment in good working order and updated.

E. Does your cub offer any educational programs such as snowmobile safe riding or avalanche awareness? Explain what classes were offered last season.

We assist all Local dealers in promotion of Avalanche Classes (When Available), Maintenance of your Snowmobile Classes, Snowmobile Safety Classes, Maintenance of you ATV Classes in spring and fall. Each year we send Members to the Silverton Advanced Avalanche Classes. We direct inquiries to the Colorado Avalanche Information Center web site. We Send all Our Groomer Operators to Classes for Updates sponsored by the machine manufacturer in Grand Junction Colorado. These events are always well attended when not effected and /or canceled by COVID.

The Uncompander Valley Trail Riders partner with Montrose County, U. S. Forest Service, Gunnison County, Bureau of Land Management, State of Colorado and the Colorado Parks and Recreation. Many of the local businesses in town are member sponsors of the club which creates a mutually beneficial promotional network. Snowmobiling is a well-received recreation activity for the local economy and provides an expansion on other local groups to include Fat Tire Bikes Snowshoeing, Cross Country Skiing, Dog Sledding and a Yurt Trail System.

B. If your club is awarded this grant, describe how the club will promote or acknowledge the use of Colorado snowmobile registration funds and the capital grant program as a funding source for the project?

The Uncompangre Valley Trail riders does and will submit articles in the Montrose Daily press, Montrose Mirror, and the Grand Junction Sentinel along with smaller local publications highlighting the values of the Colorado Snowmobiling Registration Funds and Capital Grant Program in addition, we acknowledge the Colorado Snowmobile Registration Funds and Capital Grant Program as the funding source for the Grooming program.

Our revenue sources include club dues, interest from our reserve maintenance fund, local swap meets, BBQ's and reserve from CSA Raffles when not canceled by COVID. The UVTR Club members donate several hundred hours of community service every year from the 150 plus members. Charity and roadside clean ups and trail clean ups are a few of the things club members do all year long.

B. Describe what aspects of the Club's grooming operations are provided by volunteers. Explain and highlight the number of volunteer hours provided last grooming season.

The UVTR groomer operators are a paid position when we have funds. If funds are unavailable groomer operators are all volunteer. Groomer labor, maintenance, storage, fuel return, fence building, is all volunteer with well over 300 hours annually. All trail maintenance operations summer and winter are conducted by volunteers through the year with 700 plus hours.

C. Does your program pay, contract or compensate for any services or aspects of its operations? Explain and highlight all compensated expenses from your last grooming season.

The UVTR pays groomer operators when we have funds. Each year we have extra expenses of transporting our Owl Creek Cat from location to location which is a Subcontracted position with CDL Drivers. Trucking is a hired-out position with CDL drivers for insurance reasons. We do compensate groomer operators and other maintenance personal 60 cents a mile to cover their fuel costs to the trail head as snowmobiles are necessary to get to our groomer on the Plateau Trail System.

D. What are the compensation rates and how are they established?

Trucking rate of 360.00 to move groomer was established from the total miles each location based on local rates. These rates will be increased this year as inflation and fuel prices

have skyrocketed. Our Mileage rate for groomers was established from total miles and need to use a snowmobile to reach the groomer during winter months.

E. Is your club trading or selling a snow cat or any equipment as part of this grant funded project? What is the value of trade/sale and how was this price established?

There is no trade for this project Maintenance and tiller repair only.



### Exhibit H - Additional Terms and Conditions

- 1. Subject to the obligations and conditions set forth in this document, title to equipment acquired under a grant will vest upon acquisition to the grantee.
- 2. The grantee's use of the equipment is subject to the following conditions:
  - a. The grantee shall use the equipment only for activities and uses that are consistent with the uses outlined by the Snowmobile Recreation fund. The equipment shall not be used to benefit private individuals, lands or projects without prior written approval from CPW.
  - b. The grantee shall be liable to CPW for any failure to use the equipment in accordance with the applicable statute, including the premature sale or disposition of the equipment. The grantee's liability for such a failure shall be equal to funds contributed by CPW under a grant from the purchase or acquisition of equipment.

### 3. Record Keeping Requirements

- a. Records must be maintained that include, at a minimum; a description of the equipment; a serial number or other identification number; who holds title; the acquisition date and cost of equipment; the percentage of State or grant funds used in the acquisition of the equipment; the location, use and condition of the equipment; and any ultimate disposition data including the date of disposal and sale price of the equipment. CPW shall at all times have the right to inspect these records upon request.
- b. A physical inventory of the equipment must be taken and the results shared with CPW in order to be reconciled with the property records held by CPW at least once every two vears.
- c. A control system must be developed by grantee to ensure adequate safeguards to prevent loss, damage or theft of equipment. Any confirmed or suspected loss, damage, or theft - whether discovered via the process described in 3.b. or otherwise, shall be investigated by grantee in cooperation with CPW.
- d. Adequate maintenance procedures must be developed and implemented to keep the equipment in good and working condition.

If awarded a snowmobile capital grant; I acknowledge and agree to the above terms and conditions.
