We are asking for this separate second grant to put a concrete floor and drain system in our garage which will consume another \$9315.00 of which we will foot \$4,000.00. We had many problems with mud and ice this year and in many of the past years and are hoping to improve the working conditions in the garage as we maintain the cat during the grooming season. This has become a safety factor for our Volunteers. We had two serious falls from ice accumulation on the dirt floor. Hopefully the drainage system will eliminate this hazard. This is a privately owned Groomer Garage, owned by the Club on our own land, so no Part C is required.

We have also applied for a summer Maintenance Grant for our Cat at a cost to us of \$10,000.00 from our treasury.

Both of our projects, Snowcat Maintenance and concrete floor for our Garage, affect our program, as if we have to stop grooming because of some failure of our equipment it will impact all snowmobilers using our trail. Hopefully the Summer maintenance will alleviate this happening. The floor project weighs heavily on our volunteers when we attempt to do hourly maintenance on our cat. We had 2 injuries this past year from slipping on the ice coat on the floor due to no drainage. We hope to alleviate this risk factor with the new floor.

The cat hasn't had a summer maintenance performed by the Prinoth dealer. We know we need a complete change of all gearbox oils, check the brake system and the drive system. It is time sensitive as we have to set up an appointment as quickly as possible to get it in.

There is no impact if we don't have any trouble with our cat and if we can adequately maintain our cat under the existing conditions
