Eleven Mile Reservoir

As of 5/21/2021, The *11 Mile Marina* reports "Trout fishing is reportedly very good. Opening saw a blustery windy day but the action was good from shore and boat. It is a good time of year for Jointed Rapala. Lots of different baits are working. Shore action remains strong and the spawn continues although it should be wrapping up soon. Salmon Peach and Garlic PowerBait have done well. Pautzke Salmon or trout eggs are also hot. Night fishing is good at 10:00 p.m., 2 and 4 in the morning. Lots of fish in the 18 to 22-inch range being caught. The water is very cold and action will improve even more as it gets to temps in the 50's."

As of 5/21/2021, pike, walleye, and saugeye will chase larger swimbaits and spoons, but we recommend suspending only a few feet down, as most ponds with pike are very shallow at St. Vrain. Pike and walleye will also chase streamers and poppers, but will usually require some form of a leader to prevent breaking free. Conditions Report - Southeast Colorado

Arkansas River - Leadville to Buena Vista

As of 5/21/2021, *Braden Baker with Ark Anglers* writes, "The outflow from Twin Lakes is now running at 20 CFS. The flows have been steadily increasing in Hayden Meadows as the runoff is beginning. Even with higher flows the clarity is good most days and improves throughout the day. Hayden Meadows is fishing well and with far less traffic than you'd see around Salida. Look toward riffles, edges, and pocket water as the temperatures are beginning to warm and food sources increase. Your best window of opportunity will be between 9 am and 5 pm. Even on recent sunny days, we are seeing some great blue-winged olive hatches through the Numbers and Granite areas with reports of good BWO hatches in the meadows as well. There should be many more opportunities to catch a mayfly hatch up here in the coming days, especially if there's any cloud cover in the forecast. If you are not in a BWO hatch, fish attractor dry droppers with longer (3') droppers as a subtle nymph rig in the pockets, edges, and riffles. Once runoff fully starts, fishing opportunities are still possible in the upper reaches of the river, although you may need to cover more water to find good holding positions. All you need is a little visibility along the edges where the fish will get pushed into with high flows. During this time, big dry flies in the soft water areas can be very productive."

Arkansas River - Buena Vista to Salida

As of 5/21/2021, *Braden Baker with Ark Anglers* writes, "The Arkansas River is still very fishable, despite a recent increase in flow. Clarity is holding around 2' in the middle basin following heavy rain yesterday but flows have come down slightly from Tuesday. While the river is stained, consider fishing high contrast flies like Prince Nymphs or rubberlegs stoneflies in tandem with caddis pupa or baetis nymphs. Streamers can also work well in the stained water, as mature brown trout take advantage of the conditions to ambush juvenile browns. Prior to the cool weather, the Mother's Day caddis hatch had made it up as far as Fisherman's Bridge. We may still see caddis in the coming days when the weather warms back up, but the cloudy weather in the forecast today looks prime for blue-winged olives. Combining the weather outlook with low flows and the current state of the snowpack, we should enjoy a few more days of relatively fishable conditions before runoff truly sets in.

Caddis hatches seem strongest in the afternoons, with adult flights and egg-laying activity in the evening and sometimes mornings. We would normally expect a semi-predictable wave of hatches moving upstream day by day, but as delayed as the hatch has been in starting this year we are seeing pockets of intense hatches fire off outside of the typical pattern. Water that reaches 54 degrees has the potential to see caddis hatches underway, giving us a wide window of opportunity to encounter this hatch. We'll update this report daily as the hatch proceeds upstream.

The blue-winged olive mayflies tend to be most active in the afternoons, with daily behavioral nymphal drifts occurring between noon and 3 pm most days. These mayflies typically wait for cloudy, often precipitous days to hatch in the afternoons, but you should be prepared regardless of the forecast. Sometimes all it takes is a single cloud to mute the sun for a hatch to occur. Recently, it seems that the clear, direct sunlight has fish content to feed just under the surface, intercepting nymphs and vulnerable emergers rather than committing to the dun on the water's surface. Next Tuesday's forecast of cooler temperatures and potential precipitation may make for more concentrated surface feeding. These mayflies are generally a #16-18 and offer some of the best "match-the-hatch" dry and dry-dropper fishing of the year. Stonefly and other large attractor nymphs will be great anchor flies while nymphing during non-hatch periods. For droppers, try midge larva and pupa, caddis larva, and blue-winged olive nymphs and emergers."

Park staff reports as of 5/21/2021, boat ramps will open effective 8:00 a.m. on May 1st, 2021. Currently, the lake is ice-free. The Visitor Center is open from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily and masks are required to enter. **Beginning May 2021**, to prevent boats from launching during hours that ANS inspections are not available, the park has installed new gates and one-way spike strips. The spike strips will allow boats to exit the lake after hours at the Island boat ramp but will prevent anyone from entering the lake during non-inspection hours. Boaters that plan to exit the lake after inspection hours should park and use the Island boat ramp so that they are not behind locked gates after hours. Early Settlers and Oak Point boat ramps will be locked every night after the ANS inspection gate closes at 8:30 p.m.

Jackson Gulch Reservoir - Mancos State Park

As of 5/7/2021, the staff at Mancos State Park report, "Most of the fishing right now has been happening from the bank with typical baits: rainbow or green PowerBait, worms, and 'crawlers. A double-hook rig with PowerBait on one hook and a worm on the other will open up your odds of both trout and yellow perch. Fishing has been good for 10-12-inch trout and small yellow perch. A few splake (brooke trout/lake trout crosses) have been caught using the same baits or small lures. In-line spinners (Mepps, Panther Martins) are working. Let the spinner sink for a count of five or six, then reel mid-speed (enough to get the blade turning but not too fast). Trout should start surfacing in the still mornings and evenings, making for good action with the fly rod, especially from a float tube or kayak."
