

All trails are open to hiking, snowshoeing, and cross-country skiing. The Legend indicates trails open to biking and horseback riding.





Please observe the following rules:

- Pets are prohibited on all trails, anywhere in the backcountry and at all ponds.
- Sign in and out at the trail register.
- Use only designated trails.
- Motorized use is prohibited on all trails.
- Respect natural and historic features.
- Pack out your trash.
- Camping is permitted in designated campsites in the developed campground only.
- Fires are permitted only in designated fire rings and grills.
- Refer to the legend on this map for designated use of trails.
- Do not shortcut trails.





WILDLIFE VIEWING ETHICS AND TECHNIQUES

Watching wildlife in their natural habitat can be relaxing, exciting and rewarding. However, we must learn to do so with as little disturbance to the animal as possible.

The following are some suggestions for successful wildlife viewing:

- Wildlife is the most active at dawn, dusk and after dark. When viewing during times of low light do not use flashlights or spotlights.
- Get out and walk the trails to see wildlife. Viewing is especially good around creeks and ponds.
- Maintain a minimum distance of at least 100 feet from wildlife. If you cause the animal to move or change what it is doing, then you are too close.
- Do not feed any animal in the park. This may create a food source that the animal becomes dependent on.
- Do not chase any animal to get its picture. This is especially true of predators such as bears, mountain lions, coyotes and foxes.
- When photographing wildlife, use a telephoto lens so that you may keep your distance.
- Park regulations prohibit the collection of feathers, antlers, skulls, etc.
- Use binoculars or a spotting scope when viewing wildlife.
- For more information on viewing wildlife ask a Park Ranger.

If you encounter a black bear ...

- STAY CALM leave the area.
- STOP back away, avoid eye contact.
- SPEAK SOFTLY do not shout.
- NEVER RUN always walk away.
- BE ALERT of your surroundings at all times.
