<b>ISSUE:</b>	<b>Should the Colorow SWA closure period be modified?</b>
<b>DISCUSSION (FACTS AND FIGURES, EXPLANATION OF ISSUE):</b>	
<p>CPW acquired Colorow SWA in 2013 and placed winter timing restrictions on the property use from Feb 1 to July 1 annually to protect big game. Since that time wild turkeys have increased their use on the SWA and there is currently no opportunity for public hunting during that time. To create the opportunity for use during the spring turkey season on the property the closure period would need to be modified.</p> <p>After consulting with District Wildlife Manger and Terrestrial Biologist, staff feels that the limited winter use by big game does not warrant a closure after April 30<sup>th</sup> annually. This preferred alternative would both protect wintering wildlife through April and provide additional hunting opportunities in the spring for turkeys in May.</p>

<b>ISSUE:</b>	Should Oxbow STL be opened to all hunters instead of limited to youth/mentor hunters only?		
<b>DISCUSSION (FACTS AND FIGURES, EXPLANATION OF ISSUE):</b>			
<p>Currently, in the regulations for the Oxbow State Trust Land (STL), PWC regulation #903(A)(129)(c) reads as follows:</p> <p>“Open for youth mentor hunting seasonally, as posted. Contact Colorado Parks and Wildlife Craig office for information.”</p> <p>The Oxbow STL is a remote property that sees very little use from hunters throughout the year. Due to its remote location in Game Management Unit 2, with very limited licenses for big game, and the low popularity of waterfowl hunting in Moffat County, the numbers of hunters using the STL are minimal.</p> <p>Historically, a state property that has been designated as “youth/mentor only” for hunting is in close proximity to a town or is extremely popular with all hunters. Creating a regulation for a property to be limited to youths and their mentors is meant to make for a more quality experience for the youth hunters. Making the Oxbow STL a property open to hunting without a limitation to youths and mentors would not diminish the overall hunting experience for any hunters wanting to utilize the property.</p>

<b>ISSUE:</b>	Should CPW adopt permanent W-9 regulations for the new SKCK fishing access easement on the Yampa River near Phippsburg, Colorado in Routt County?
<b>DISCUSSION (FACTS AND FIGURES, EXPLANATION OF ISSUE):</b>	
<p>In August 2021, SKCK Settlement Corporation (“SKCK”) granted CPW a perpetual fishing access easement on the Yampa River. The acquisition was part of the 2019 RFP.</p> <p>Beginning on September 21, 2022, the access easement was open to the public pursuant to temporary access restrictions issued by the Director pursuant to Chapter W-9 #900.B (“Only properties listed in this chapter are open for public access. The Director may open newly acquired properties for public access for a period not to exceed nine (9) months pending the adoption of permanent regulations. ... If a property is opened for public access pursuant to this provision, the property shall be posted with a list of applicable access restrictions. It shall be unlawful for any person or vehicle to enter any such property, except in accordance with its posting and the applicable restrictions.”).</p> <p>The purpose of this issue paper is to formally codify the current temporary access restrictions as permanent rules adopted by the Commission.</p>

Public access is limited to the “Fishing Access Area” and “Public Access Detour” highlighted on the posted property map. Public access is restricted to walk-in access only.</li> <li>2. Public access is prohibited from one hour after sunset to sunrise daily.</li> <li>3. Public access is prohibited from December 1 through March 31.</li> <li>4. Camping is prohibited.</li> <li>5. Fires are prohibited.</li> <li>6. Dogs are prohibited.</li> <li>7. Drones are prohibited.</li> <li>8. Vehicle access is prohibited beyond the designated parking area. Parking is prohibited except as posted at the parking area.</li> <li>9. Public access is allowed only from the designated parking area.</li> <li>10.
