Comments received after noon on **February 27, 2026** will be held and shared with the Commission as part of the subsequent meeting mailing.

FINAL REGULATIONS

Chapter W-2 - "Big Game" - 2 CCR 406-2

Open for final consideration of any necessary corrections or administrative clean-ups to regulations previously adopted by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for the 2026 big game seasons, including, but not limited to, game management unit boundaries, season dates, limited license areas and manner of take provisions for bighorn sheep, mountain goat, deer, elk, pronghorn, moose, bear and mountain lion, and regulations otherwise necessary for implementation of the 2026 big game seasons.

Chapter W-5 - "Small Game - Migratory Game Birds" - 2 CCR 406-5

Open for annual review and final consideration of regulations related to waterfowl and migratory bird hunting seasons and related provisions, including season dates, bag and possession limits and manner of take provisions.

Chapter W-9 - "Wildlife Properties" 2 CCR 406-9

Open for annual review and final consideration of regulations related to generally applicable and property-specific requirements for, or restrictions on use of, wildlife properties controlled by the Division of Parks and Wildlife, including State Trust Lands leased by the Division. Specific considerations include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Adopting property-specific regulations for the new Boreas Pass Ranch Hunting Easement.
- Adopting property-specific regulations for the new Collard Ranch State Wildlife Area.
- Adopting property-specific regulations for the Georgetown State Wildlife Area.
- Modifying property-specific regulations for the Knight-Imler State Wildlife Area.
- Adopting property-specific regulations for the new Michigan Creek State Wildlife Area.
- Formalizing Nakagawa's State Wildlife Area posted regulations and prohibitions in Chapter W-9.
- Modifying property-specific regulations for Ralston Creek State Wildlife Area.
- Removing Smith Lake State Wildlife Area from Chapter W-9 regulations.
- Modifying the name of Teter-Michigan Creek State Wildlife Area.

Chapter W-0 - "General Provisions" 2 CCR 406-0

Open for consideration of regulatory changes to implement SB25-003 Semiautomatic Firearms & Rapid-Fire Devices.

Chapter W-3 - "Furbearers and Small Game, Except Migratory Birds" 2 CCR 406-3

Open for consideration of annual changes to game bird seasons, excluding turkey, and other small game seasons and related provisions, including season dates, bag and possession limits and manner of take provisions, changes necessary to implement Colorado Parks and Wildlife's Beaver Conservation and Management Strategy, and changes necessary to implement Colorado Parks and Wildlife's Furbearer Stakeholder Process Management & Policy Recommendations.

Except for the day and time indicated for when the meeting is scheduled to begin, the order indicated for each agenda item is approximate and subject to change when necessary to accommodate the Commission's schedule.

Modification of Proposed Rules prior to adoption: subject to the provisions of Section 24-4-103, C.R.S., modification of these proposals may be made by the Division of Parks and Wildlife or the Commission before the Commission promulgates final rules and regulations on the above topics.

Opportunity to submit alternate proposals and provide comment: the Commission will afford all interested persons an opportunity to submit alternate proposals, written data, views or arguments and to present them orally, if time permits, at the meeting unless it deems such oral presentation unnecessary. Use of Consent Agenda:

In order to increase the Parks and Wildlife Commission’s efficiency and allow more time for consideration of parks and wildlife policy and contested issues, some or all of this regulatory agenda may be listed for action by the Commission as part of a “Consent Agenda” for this meeting.

*The process for placing matters on the Consent Agenda is as follows:
The Director identifies matters where the recommended action follows established policy or precedent, there has been agreement reached or the matter is expected to be uncontested and non-controversial.*

Regulatory Matters on the Consent Agenda are noticed for hearing at the same time and in the same manner as other Consent Agenda items. If a member of the Commission requests further consideration of an item on the Consent Agenda, that item will be withdrawn from the Consent Agenda and discussed at the end of the meeting or at the next meeting. The Consent Agenda may be voted on without the necessity of reading individual items. Any Commission member may request clarification from the Director of any matter on the Consent Agenda.

OTHER AGENDA ITEMS: The Parks and Wildlife Commission may consider and make policy, program implementation, and other non-regulatory decisions, which may be of public interest at this meeting.
