FINAL REGULATIONS

Agenda Item 10 - Chapter W-2 - "Big Game" - 2 CCR 406-2

The Commission adopted regulations including, but not limited to, the following:

 Adoption of all limited license numbers for black bear, deer, elk, pronghorn and moose for all Game Management Units in the state that have limited licenses for these species for the 2021 big game seasons.

Agenda Item 11b - Chapter W-9 - "Wildlife Properties" 2 CCR 406-9

The Commission adopted regulations including, but not limited to, the following:

Adding properties to the State Trust Land Public Access Program.

CITIZEN PETITIONS



Agenda Item 21.1 - Chapter W-2 - "Big Game" - 2 CCR 406-2

The Commission adopted the Director's written recommendation to DENY two petitions for rulemaking requesting that the Commission revise big game regulations, as follows:

- A <u>Citizen Petition for Rulemaking</u> requesting that fall turkey licenses be considered as a qualifying license for the big game draw.
- A <u>Citizen Petition for Rulemaking</u> requesting that there be no separate license allocation to nonresidents applying for the moose, sheep, or goat draw, and that nonresident hunters receive no more than 10% of available moose, bighorn sheep and mountain goat licenses for all hunt codes.

Agenda Item 21.2 - Chapter W-16 - "Parks and Wildlife Procedural Rules" 2 CCR 406-16

The Commission adopted the Director's written recommendation to DENY a petition for rulemaking requesting that the Commission revise the regulation related to refunds and preference point restorations, as follows:

• A <u>Citizen Petition for Rulemaking</u> requesting that an additional preference point be issued when a hunter returns a limited license.
