- Long Range Precision Rifle Area

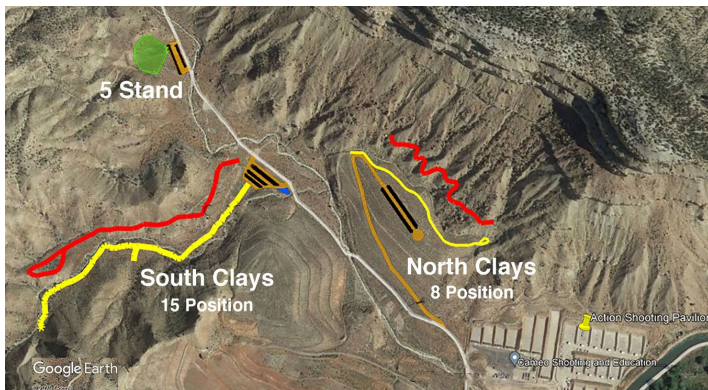

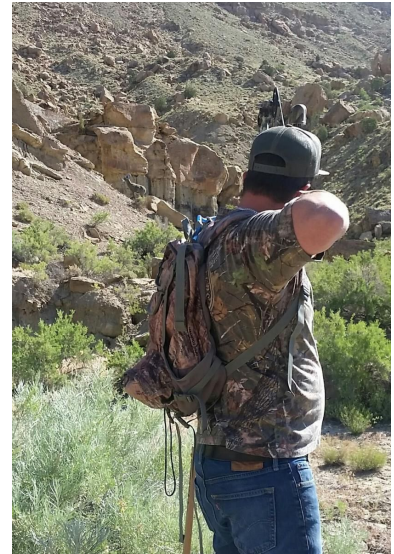

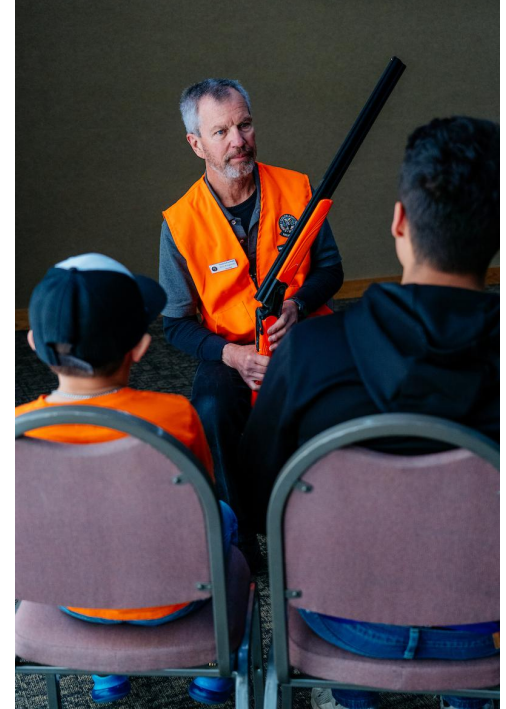
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Hunter Education and Continued Education

- Over 70,000 volunteer hours since 2019

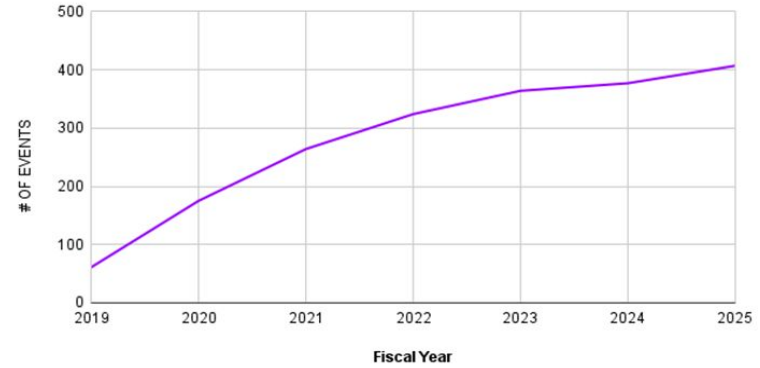


Utilization

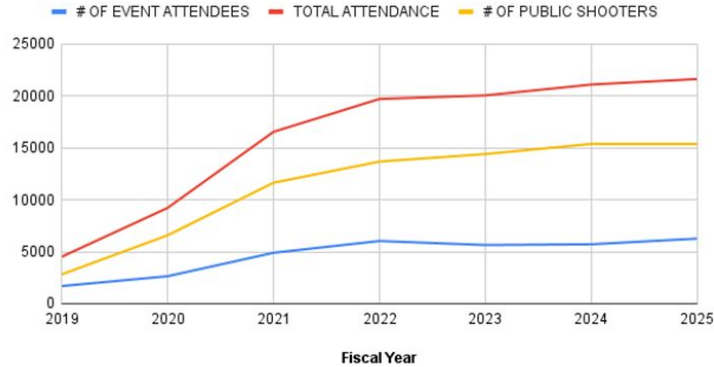
- Monthly Use

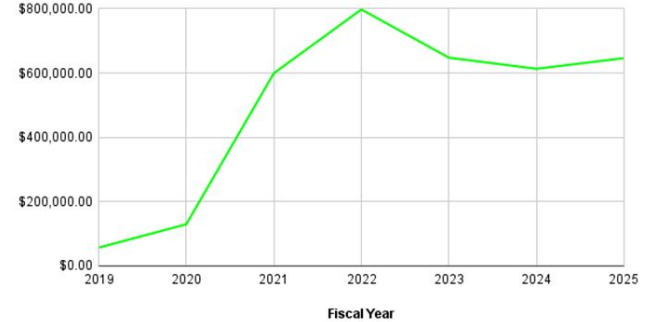

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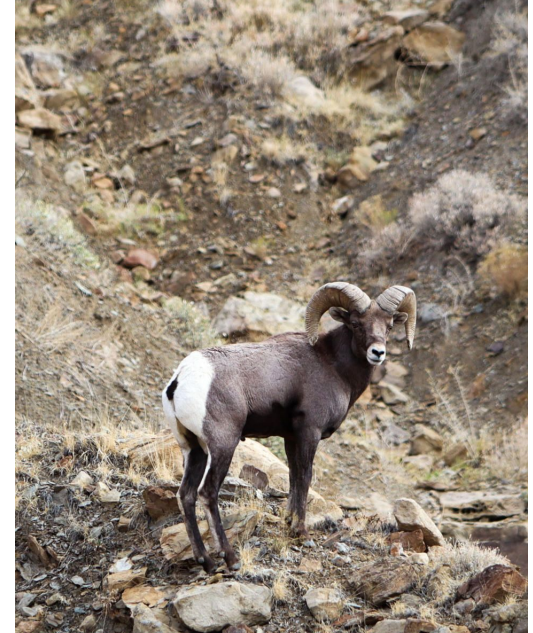
