General Information: Trinidad Reservoir, measuring approximately 800 acres, offers good fishing for walleye, saugeye, bass, catfish, rainbow trout, black crappie, yellow perch and wiper. The reservoir is located within Trinidad Lake State Park. Visit http://cpw.state.co.us/placestogo/parks/trinidadlake for park hours, fees, and other information.

Regulations

- Daily bag and possession limit for walleye/saugeye is 5 fish in aggregate with no more than 1 fish over 18 inches in length.
- Bass (largemouth, small-mouth, spotted) must be a minimum of 15 inches in length to be kept.
- Bag and possession limits other than walleye/saugeye are listed by the Arkansas drainage in the regulations brochure.

Sportfishing Notes

Walleye/Saugeye

These fish are managed to achieve high catch rates and relatively liberal harvest. Best fishing for walleye and saugeye will start in May and run into the early fall. Fish can be found in all locations in the reservoir.

Trout

The trout fishery is a mixture of "put and take" and "put and grow" management strategies. Catch rates for trout are very high in the reservoir and quality of fish is pretty good with fish in the 14 to 16 inch range being fairly common. Trout are caught in all locations in the lake.

Other Species




WALLEYE AND SAUGEYE

Data from 2019 sampling indicated healthy fish that were in good condition. The population is composed of many fish

in the mid-sized range and a few large fish (see figure below). Gizzard shad were stocked in 2016, to help provide an additional forage base for sportfish. This should help keep fish in good condition.

In 2020, anglers can expect to catch high quality walleye and saugeye, particularly between May and August. Please read the mercury advisory for walleye and saugeye over 15" in length.





CHANNEL CATFISH

Catfish numbers have been fairly stable over the years, with high quality fish present. Trinidad catfish appear to cycle up and down over the years depending on stocking and water levels. In 2019, 8 channel catfish were captured via trotlining with an average length and weight of 27.4" and 10.09 lbs, with the largest being 33.9" and 18.81 lbs. Most of the catfish in Trinidad are over 20 inches in length. Anglers who desire to catch catfish can do very well with traditional methods in 2020; focus efforts towards the west end.


BLACK BASS

Largemouth and smallmouth are typically caught in the reservoir. Thirty-eight smallmouth bass were sampled with gillnets in 2019. Numbers of bass in Trinidad are pretty good with smallmouth being more abundant than largemouth bass. The smallmouth sampled in 2019 ranged in size from 7.8 to 18 inches and ranged in weight between 0.2 to 3 pounds. Many of the bass are below the minimum 15 inch length limit, but some very good quality bass are taken each year and are caught during bass tournaments on the reservoir. Bass are available to anglers year round with almost all bass fishing techniques.



PANFISH AND WIPER

Trinidad also has good numbers of bluegill, black crappie, wiper and yellow perch. Bluegill and crappie occur at low levels and vary greatly from year to year. Black crappie are stocked and fishing should be very good. Wiper occur at moderate numbers and can be difficult to catch. There are some very nice quality wipers in the population and anglers have been successful in the past using chicken livers as bait. Wipers have been stocked since 2014.




The number of wipers sampled in 2017 was the highest number in the last seven years, but 2018 saw a decrease in the number of fish sampled. Wiper numbers were up again in 2019.

The yellow perch fishery has been improving over the last few years and anglers have caught some impressive perch in the reservoir. Several master angler-size perch were caught in the past four years.

RAINBOW TROUT

Rainbow trout are a staple at Trinidad Reservoir. Fish typically are stocked monthly between February and September, depending on availability and weather. Trout survive and grow well at Trinidad Reservoir, and anglers have the most success catching trout between May and September. However, trout fishing can be productive any time of year and fish that reach 15" in length are fairly common, with larger fish present.

Fishing in 2020 should continue to be good for trout, particularly in the spring and fall. Traditional trout fishing methods should work well.
