2020-2021 Snowmobile Capital Grant funding awards as recommended by the State Recreational Trails Committee.

This letter is a summary and explanation of the enclosed Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) 2020-2021 Snowmobile Capital Grant funding recommendations for Parks and Wildlife Commission (PWC) approval during the July 2020 meeting. We are recommending approval for 9 grants for a total award amount of \$368,125.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The State Trails Program, a statewide program within Colorado's Parks and Wildlife Division (CPW), administers grants for trail-related projects on an annual basis. Local, county, and state governments, federal agencies, special recreation districts, and non-profit organizations with management responsibilities over public lands may apply for and are eligible to receive snowmobile capital grants.

### Colorado's Snowmobile Program

The Snowmobile Program is statutorily created, C.R.S. 33-14-101 through 33-14-119, and is funded through the sale of snowmobile registrations and use permits. It is estimated that over 33,000 vehicles will be registered in the 2019-2020 season. The price of an annual snowmobile registration is \$30.25. Funds are used to support the Statewide Snowmobile Capital Grant and Grooming Programs as well as support for snowmobile registration operations. Funding is also made available to support safety, education and enforcement patrols. The program's primary goal is to improve and enhance snowmobile recreation opportunities across the state while promoting the safe and responsible use of snowmobiles. The Snowmobile Program partners with the Colorado Snowmobile Association (CSA) who represents organized snowmobiling within the state. There are 35 snowmobile clubs under the CSA umbrella; of these 35 clubs, 27 of them participate in the state wide grooming program.

Last year, \$721,855 was provided from the snowmobile recreation fund to grooming clubs to maintain and sign over 2700 miles of winter trails which are open to all winter sports enthusiasts. Grooming funds enable the clubs to cover the costs of fuel, insurance, equipment maintenance and repairs. Clubs that groom typically apply for capital grant funding to assist with the purchase of grooming equipment, construction of facilities to house equipment or trailhead improvements.



## **State Trails Committee**

The creation and role of the Committee are set forth in sections 33-11-105 to 107, C.R.S. In addition to using the Committee as an advisory body on the expenditure of funds appropriated by the General Assembly, the Commission also uses the Committee as an advisory body on the expenditure of federal and GOCO funds available for recreational trail purposes. The Committee consists of nine members appointed by the Commission representing each of the seven congressional districts from which one member represents Off Highway Vehicle interests. One At Large member who represents Snowmobile interests and one member represents the GOCO Board. The Committee reviews, scores, ranks and submits recommendations for funding of Recreation Trails Grants to the Commission for their consideration and final approval. Sections 33-11-105 to 33-11-107, C.R.S., describe the roles, responsibilities and relationship of the State Trails Committee in working with the Commission.

### **GRANT APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS:**

Snowmobile Capital Grant applications are sent out by e-mail, ground mail and are posted on CPW's Trails Program website each year. Trail grant opportunities are publicized through newsletters, the State website, and e-mail information networks. Technical assistance for grant preparation is provided by the State Trails Coordinators to potential applicants requesting assistance.

The Parks and Wildlife Commission (the Commission) has authorized a subcommittee structure to oversee and organize the grant selection process. Subcommittee members are appointed for the purpose of reviewing and ranking grants and compiling funding recommendations for the Committee.

### **Snowmobile Capital Grant Review and Ranking Process**

The subcommittee conducts a fair and comprehensive review of all grant applications submitted before making recommendations to the Committee. All projects are evaluated and ranked against each other. The Snowmobile Capital grant review and ranking procedure follows a three-tiered recommendation and approval process. Applications are scored and evaluated by the Snowmobile Grant Review and Ranking Subcommittee which ranks the applications in order of recommended funding priority. The ranked applications are passed to the State Trails Committee which evaluates the applications in ranked order and recommends funding strategies to the Commission. Commission gives final approval of the projects recommended for funding. Public input is solicited as part of the grant review process. Public comment is accepted by e-mail, letter, and during public meetings.

### **Snowmobile Capital Grant Review and Ranking Subcommittee**

The Snowmobile Capital Grant Review and Ranking Subcommittee is comprised of fourteen (14) scoring members including the subcommittee Chairperson who is a member of the State Trails Committee chosen by the Commission to represent snowmobile interests, and nine (9)

snowmobile district representatives, one from each of the state’s 9 designated snowmobile areas, who are appointed by the Chairperson; and four (4) Colorado Parks and Wildlife Regional Trail Coordinators.

*Appendix A* lists the members of the State Trails Committee and members of the Snowmobile Subcommittee and the area they represent.

**2019-2020 Snowmobile Capital Grant Applications**

Snowmobile Capital Grant applications were due April 24, 2020. Applications for ten (10) eligible projects were received prior to the April 24th deadline for a total grant request of \$558,350.00. Applicants made presentations to the Snowmobile Subcommittee on May 16, 2020 via Zoom.

**DIVISION RECOMMENDATION:**

CPW staff and the Snowmobile Grant Review and Ranking Subcommittee have recommended the attached 2020-2021 Snowmobile Capital Grants ranking and funding list (*Appendix C*) for the Committee’s review and recommendation. It is suggested that minor adjustments of project funding levels be permitted at the discretion of the CPW Director or his designee. Furthermore, it is recommended that any additional project money that is received be rolled over into the 2021-2022 snowmobile capital grant cycle, or into the 2020-2021 grooming season.
