implementation of the 2021 big game seasons.

Chapter W-3 - "Furbearers and Small Game, Except Migratory Birds" 2 CCR 406-3 (Step 2 of 2)

Open for annual review and final consideration of regulations related to game bird seasons, excluding turkey, and other small game seasons and related provisions, including season dates, bag and possession limits and manner of take provisions. Specific regulatory changes include, but are not limited to, the following:

• Modifying the harvest limit, season dates, and hunting area boundary for greater prairie chicken.

Chapter W-5 - "Small Game - Migratory Game Birds" - 2 CCR 406-5 (Step 2 of 2)

Open for annual review and final consideration of regulations related to waterfowl and migratory bird hunting seasons and related provisions, including season dates, bag and possession limits and manner of take provisions. Specific considerations include, but are not limited to, the following:

• Eliminating the Northern Front Range goose zone and combining it with the Balance of the Central Flyway zone.

Chapter W-9 - "Wildlife Properties" 2 CCR 406-9 and those related provisions of Chapter W-0 ("General Provisions" 2 CCR 406-0) necessary to accommodate changes to or ensure consistency with Chapter W-9 (Step 2 of 2)

Open for annual review and final consideration of regulations related to generally applicable and property-specific requirements for, or restrictions on use of, wildlife properties controlled by the Division of Parks and Wildlife, including State Trust Lands leased by the Division. Specific considerations include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Revising the requirements to access State Wildlife Areas and State Trust Lands leased by the Division and creating Colorado State Wildlife Area passes.
- Prohibiting all water contact activities at Douglas Reservoir State Wildlife Area unless actively fishing. (NE)
- Adding Elk Springs Ranch State Wildlife Area and removing Sagebrush Draw State Trust Land. (NW)
- Prohibiting fires and hunting at Sands Lake State Wildlife Area and prohibiting hunting at the adjoining CPW property located downstream of Colo. Hwy 291 bridge to Chaffee County Road 175 in Mount Shavano SWA. (SE)
- Prohibiting unsafe activities at Watson Lake State Wildlife Area. (NE)
- Adding property-specific regulations for the Brett Gray Ranch State Trust Land to specify access points and parking areas, as well as clarifying camping restrictions on the property. (SE)
- Consolidating Burro Springs 1 & 2, Carnero, Biedel Creek, Mogotas Arroyo, Sanderson Gulch, and San Juan Creek State Trust Lands under one name and set of regulations. (SW)
- Removing Arkansas River State Wildlife Area. (SE)

The Consent Agenda may be voted on without the necessity of reading individual items. Any Commission member may request clarification from the Director for any matter on the Consent Agenda.
