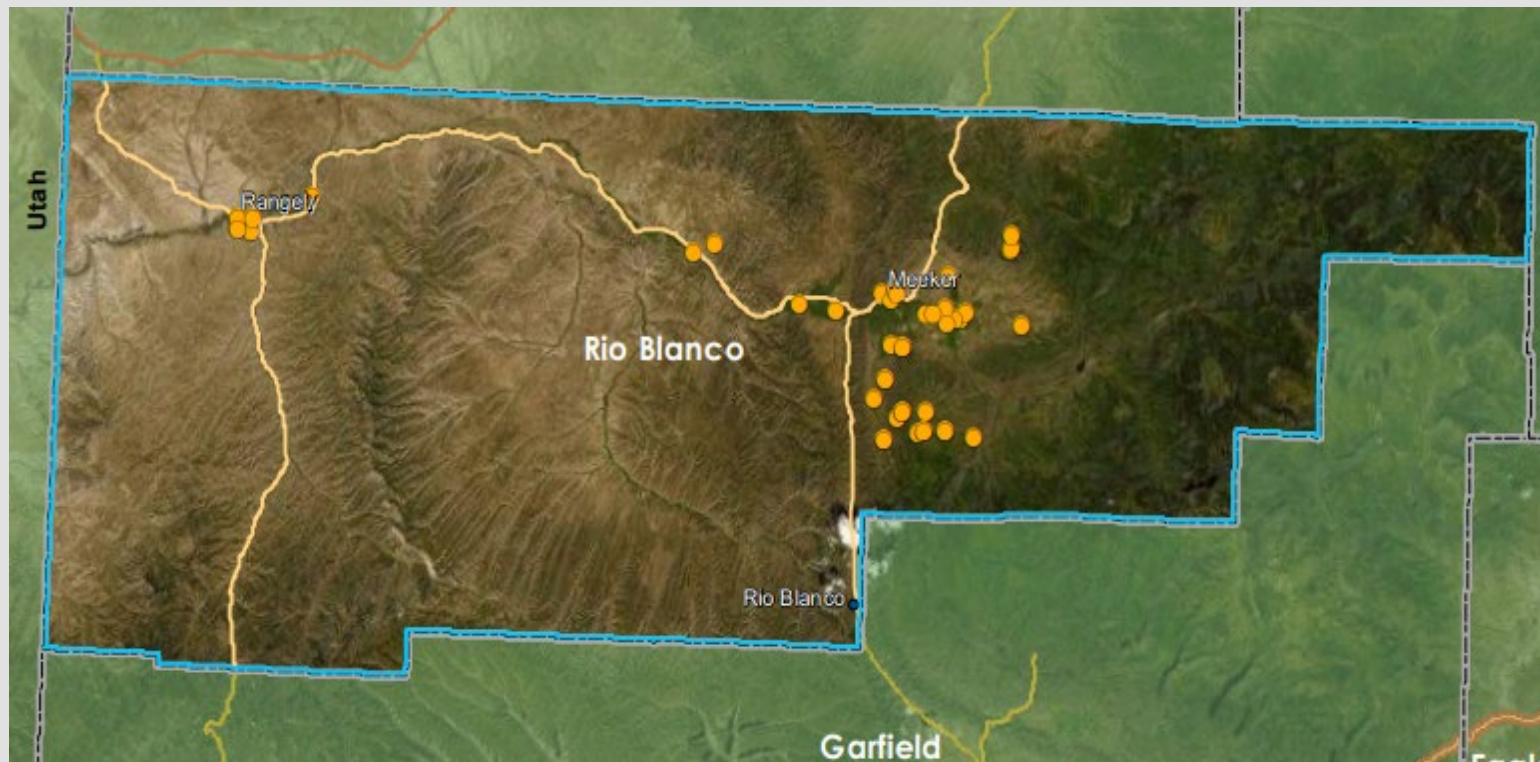

CYCA transforms lives and landscapes by creating opportunities for youth, young adults, and veterans to serve their community on public lands

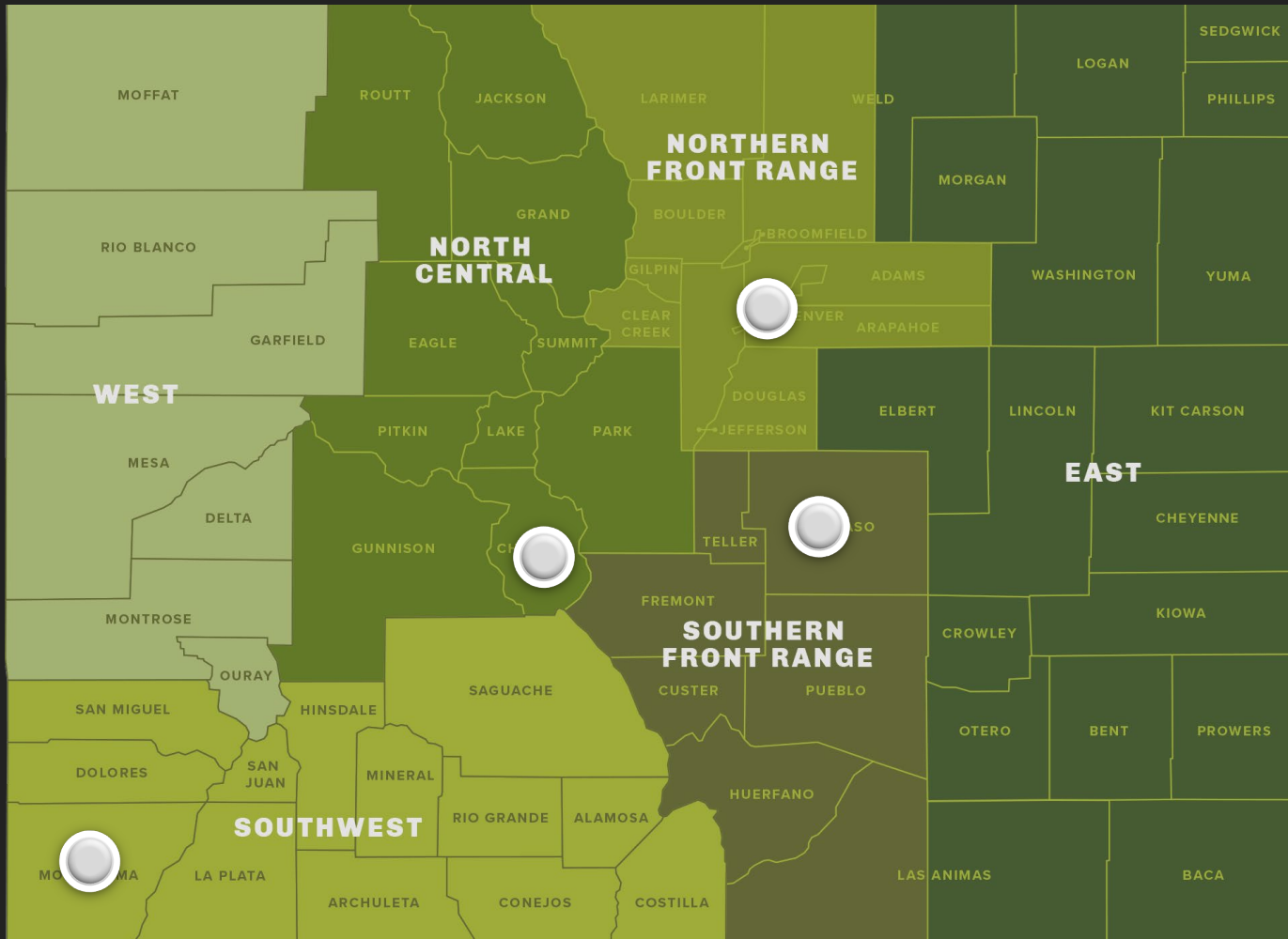
Projects include trail construction, invasive species removal, fire fuel mitigation, habitat restoration
