

Wolverine Biology

- World's largest terrestrial weasel (15-40lbs)
- Solitary, large home ranges (8x larger than lynx; 20x larger than bobcats & coyotes)



Well-adapted to cold, snowy environments






Modeled Wolverine Habitat in Colorado





Wolverine in Colorado

- Colorado could hold an estimated 125-150 individuals
- ~20% of estimated habitat capacity of the western U.S.
- Restoration in Colorado is meaningful for the species in the western United States





History in Colorado

- The Commission declared the wolverine as "state endangered" in 1973
- No known wolverine in Colorado
- 1998 Wildlife Commission approval for restoration
- 2010 Restoration effort halted due to lack of Federal assurances



Wolverine Restoration - Federal Status

- Since 1994 Petitioned five times
- May 2022 Court mandated a final determination within 18 months
 - Current status: Proposed to be listed as a threatened species
- November 2023 USFWS must issue a determination






Colorado Wolverine Restoration
