## **BAI INSTRUCTOR REQUIREMENTS**

Basic Archery Instructors (BAI) instructors must report a minimum of 10 hours to the NASP® database each year. NASP® has provided the following guidance for the 10 hours of in-class instruction required to keep up certification for BAIs. Below is information for the variety of in-person and virtual learning environments that many are implementing this school year.

- In-Person: Teach in-school lessons as normal.
- Virtual: The BAI should at a minimum, teach Eye Dominance, Making and Using a String Bow, and the Eleven Steps to Archery Success as part of the virtual classroom.
- **Hybrid:** Teach Eye Dominance, Making and Using a String Bow, and the Eleven Steps to Archery Success as part of the virtual classroom, followed by in-person classes with the range.

If a BAI is unable to reach the 10 hour requirement while teaching during the school year, their status is changed to suspended at the end of the reporting period with notification from NASP®. A refresher course will be available on the NASP® <u>BAI website</u> to help instructors stay current on safety and protocols. After two years of not reporting hours, certification would be removed and the instructor would need to take another BAI course. Remember to record teaching hours on the BAI website.
