Critter Crates are available to educators for check-out free of charge. The teaching kits make it easy to lead successful and fun wildlife lessons. Resources include hands-on wildlife artifacts and field gear, audio-visuals, kids books and background information.

Animal Tracks and Signs Crate

Mammal, bird, and reptile tracks; backyard wildlife activities; beaver-chewed stick and animal scat; animal signs lesson plans; Peterson's Field Guide; Tracks in the Wild.

Aquatic Adventures Crate

Take students to a stream or pond and perform basic sampling of the water and aquatic invertebrates in the area. Contains: Supplies to conduct scientific wetlands research—wading boots; Golden Guide to Pond Life; thermometers; 'Wetland Metaphors' bag; flower and plant press; nets; oxygen and pH test kits.

The Bat Crate

Bat specimen mount and see-through model; Discover Bats video; Bat Chat audio tape and transcript; Kids Love Bats poster; "Where's My Baby?" role playing activity; the Bat House Builder's Handbook; The Good Guys publication; America's Neighborhood Bats; Zipping, Zapping, Zooming Bats; and Stellaluna.

Bear Critter Crate

This kit is designed specifically for younger audiences. Black bear puppet; bear hide and skull; Living with Wildlife in Bear Country brochure; slide show; The Wonder Series: Everywhere Bear; Project WILD activities; Be Bear Aware coloring book; activity materials for 3 great games!

The Bird Crate

Bird nests and eggs; barn owl and hummingbird puppets; talons and tracks; birds of prey chart; Wonders on the Wing video; favorite birds coloring pages; Peterson's Bird Calls CD and tape; How Birds Fly and Inside a Egg books.

Bug Box (Insects and Spiders, Too!)

Insect sweep nets; magnifying bug boxes; plastic insect replicas; insect/spider stamps and ink pads; Creepy Crawlies book; insect stencils; The Big Bug Search book.

Compass Kit

Compasses, maps and reference guides to teach students navigation skills.

The Elk Trunk (Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation)

Books and activities for teaching students about elk. Contains: tape of elk sounds and calls; elk hide, antler, and tracks; Wild About Elk educator's guide; Wild About Elk video; A Year at Elk Meadow book. Good resource for many audiences.

The Fire Box

"Fire's Role in Nature" poster; tree and bark samples; items that create & extinguish fires; fire prevention CDs; six dioramas; Fire: Friend or Foe book.

Lynx Crate

"Return of the Snowcat" high school module (includes 7 lesson plans, DVD, maps and more); bioartifacts include lynx, mountain lion, bobcat, wolverine, American marten.

Mammal Hides & Skulls Crate

Mammal hides, antlers, and skulls; mammal lesson plans binder; Season of the Red Fox and Bears for Kids (books); Amazing Mammals activity guide; "Woods and Mountains Mammals" posters.

Mountain Lion Teacher's Box

Materials for teaching students about mountain lions and their place in Colorado. Contains: Mountain lion slide show; mountain lion activity game; hides, skulls and tracks; coloring pages; The Puma and Great Cats books; "Colorado Predator" poster.

Outdoor Exploration Kit

Binoculars, hand lenses, field microscopes, guides and other items useful for outdoor games/activities.

Prairie Crate

Mammal hides, skulls and tracks of prairie animals, including pronghorn, prairie dog and badger, as well as prairie related books and activities.

Reptiles and Amphibians Crate

Amphibians and reptiles slide show; books, guides and publications; turtle shells, skulls, and specimen; snakes poster; bull snake skin.

Safari in a Box - Colorado Style (Created by Safari Club International Foundation Sables)

Hunting-related/wildlife management activities and guides; common Colorado wildlife hides and skulls, tracks and scat replicas; wildlife classroom activity guides; animal tracks poster.

Urban Wildlife Crate

Track molds and replicas; skulls and scat; backyard wildlife guides; urban slide show; mammal hides.

Urban Wildlife Puppet Show

Puppets, script, and props to learn and perform show at your school.

Wildlife Forensics Kit

Investigate wildlife tracks, hair, and skulls to figure out a "whodunnit" mystery. Track molds and replicas, skulls, fur samples, antlers, and activity materials.

CPW requires at least two weeks advance notice when making a Critter Crate reservation. Critter Crates are popular, so please plan well in advance.

- Please plan to <u>pick up AND drop off your borrowed items on the pre-arranged Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday.</u> The Northeast Region Office in Denver is open 8am 5pm.
- We cannot guarantee crate availability for your requested dates.
- Your request must be confirmed before you can pick-up materials <u>Please be sure you received a confirmation before traveling to the office for pick-up!</u>
- Requests made with less than 2 weeks notice may not be accommodated. *Please sign-up early!*
- The normal loan period is two weeks. More time can be requested but is not guaranteed.
- Users must inventory the contents of kits and critter crates on receipt and before return. Please help us ensure they remain intact for the next user.
