#### CWD WILLIAM'S FORK - FACT SHEET

WHO: The Colorado Division of Wildlife (CDOW) and USDA APHIS - Wildlife Services (WS)

WHAT: The CDOW and WS will begin a surgical strike, site specific, to remove deer and elk located along the William's Fork River in GMU 12 and 13. All deer and elk removed will be tested for CWD.

WHEN: Deer and elk removal will begin on Monday April 15th and will continue through Friday April 19th, 2002.

WHERE: On public and private lands, within a 5 mile radius of the Motherwell Ranch which is located in Routt County approximately 18 miles east of Hamilton, CO. along Hwy 317 and Routt County Road 29.

WHY: In January and February 2002, over 330 deer and 40 elk were removed from inside the game fence of the Motherwell Ranch. Two of these deer tested positive for CWD. In April 2002, Another 311 deer were removed and tested within a 5mile radius of the Motherwell Ranch. Two of these additional deer also tested positive for CWD. The CDOW may have the opportunity to eliminate CWD by aggressively taking all deer and elk from the area surrounding the ranch enclosure. The CDOW is attempting to remove any deer and elk that could have possibly been exposed or infected with CWD in this area, prior to their natural spring migration. Many thousands of deer and elk will be moving through this area in the near future thus it is critical to remove animals that have been exposed immediately.

#### ADDITIONAL FACTS:

Disposal: The Colorado Department of Agriculture will incinerate all deer and elk carcasses on site at the Indian Run SWA.

All animals removed will be tested for CWD.

All carcasses will be removed from the field.

WS will be using helicopters to aid the CDOW in removing deer and elk.

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
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
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
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- ❖ Feb-Apr '02 leadership opts for local culling
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- ♣ Apr '02 609 mule deer & 135 elk culled in Motherwell vicinity
  - ❖ 1/128 bucks (<1%) & 5/316 does (~2%) infected; no elk infected
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  - number culled was ~1% of the estimated D-07 deer herd size in 2002 (609/60,871)





# Composite epidemic curve (field data vs. model)




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  - number culled was ~1% of the estimated D-07 deer herd size in 2002 (609/60,871)

#### White River herd (D-07)


- Goal: eradication!
- Tactic: intensive but focal
- Duration: one shot
- Licensing trend: conservative
- Timing: increasingly early

#### Red Feather herd (D-04)

- Goal: suppression
- Tactic: extensive with focal
- Duration: ongoing (2000–05)
- Licensing trend: liberal(ish)
- Timing: proportional late

Third season license numbers strongly affect prevalence in subsequent years.


