PROGRAM RULES



- 1) All hunters must check in prior to their hunt. Any hunter not checking in at the predetermined time or meeting spot will not be allowed to access Agner Mtn., until the following check-in time.
- 2) All hunters and non-hunting guests will be required to sign and return the Assumption of Risk Agreement and Release Form (provided in the successful hunt packet you will receive). All hunters and their one (1) non-hunting guest must each sign the Risk Release form. Prior to the hunt, you must submit these waivers from each individual entering Agner Mtn.
- 3) A hunt survey form will be provided to each hunter at check-in and must be returned to Agner Mtn. after the completion of your hunt either to check-in headquarters or by mailing to the address printed on the survey. All surveys must be submitted within two weeks of your hunt's completion. This is mandatory. Wildlife management depends on accurate reporting of harvest.
- 4) All areas of Agner Mtn. are open to public hunting. Your hunting areas will be determined by Agner Mountain staff when you arrive at the designated meeting location. The hunt areas will be determined by a number of factors: game concentrations, road conditions, livestock operations, the number of other hunters, and other Agner Mtn. operations. Our goal is to provide you with as enjoyable, successful hunt as possible. When you check in at the designated location, you will be provided with a packet of information that will include maps, directions to the designated meeting areas. A map of the Ranching for Wildlife Program area will also be included in your Successful Hunt packet.
- 5) Agner Mtn. is divided into several large hunting units. Each unit will have a limited number of hunters that will be allowed access to that unit each day. Units will be assigned on a first come basis. To avoid overcrowding you must hunt on the unit you are assigned for a full 2 days. You can change tracts with approval of Agner Mtn. staff after the two days for the next day's hunt.
- 6) One non-hunting companion or observer will be allowed. Some exceptions will be made for hunters with disabilities. All youth hunters under the age of 18 are required to have parent or legal guardian accompany them during their hunt.
- 7) No smoking is permitted on Agner Mtn. property or in Agner Mtn. vehicles.
- 8) Our designated meeting area is at one of the Agner Mtn. main headquarters. Which headquarter will be determined by the season and proximity herd movement and will be included in the information packet you receive when you check-in. A location map will also be included in your successful hunt packet. Typically, we meet approximately 1 hour before legal shooting light (for morning hunts) and between 2 and 3 pm for afternoon hunts. Be sure to leave your phone number for us to call you if there are any changes to the meeting time or location.
- 9) No overnight camping is allowed on Agner Mtn. property. I have a list of the closest accommodations and phone numbers that can be emailed.
- 10) No pre-hunt scouting will be allowed, and no dogs allowed on Agner Mtn. property.
- 11) You are a welcome guest and your successful hunt is an important part of our cooperative wildlife management program. We do not allow hunting for any game animals other than that authorized by your Ranching for Wildlife license.
- 12) No possession or consumption of alcohol or illegal substances will be allowed on Agner Mtn. property.
- 13) No trash or foreign objects will be left on Agner Mtn.
- 14) No discharging of firearms is allowed except for the direct harvest of the animal you are licensed to hunt.
- 15) All hunters must abide by all state laws and Agner Mtn. rules. Violation of state laws, regulations, and/or Agner Mtn. rules may result in expulsion from Agner Mtn., loss of hunting privileges, and possible criminal prosecution. We uphold the highest standards for fair-chase and ethical hunting.
- 16) Guiding services will be provided to hunters holding an either-sex deer license or October/November either-sex elk license at no charge. Optional guiding services will be provided at no charge for hunters with a valid either-sex elk license during the January seasons. If you are interested in the optional guiding service in January, please contact the ranch prior to your hunt.
