



RANCH RULES

- 1) All hunts are guided by ranch personnel. Your guide will meet you at the designated meeting area. Any hunter not checking in at the predetermined time or meeting spot will not be allowed to access ranch until the following check-in time. On the day of your hunt, your signed ranch liability waivers will be collected at check in. Your guide will provide transportation, assist you with the hunt, and help with field dressing and game retrieval.
- 2) Due to the guided aspect of your hunt, reservations are required. We recommend you make reservations as soon as possible, dates fill up quickly. Please email john.kerr@threeforksranch.com, no phone calls will be accepted for reservations; email only.
- 3) All areas of the ranch are open to public hunting. Your hunting areas will be determined by your guide and ranch management. The hunt areas will be determined by a number of factors: game concentrations, road conditions, livestock operations, other hunters, and other ranch operations.
- 4) Non-hunting companions or observers will not be allowed. Some exceptions will be made for hunters with disabilities. All youth hunters under the age of 18 are required to have parent or legal guardian accompany them during their hunt.
- 5) No smoking is permitted in Ranch vehicles or on Ranch property – this is for fire safety, hunting conditions, and protection of Ranch vehicles and other property
- 6) Our designated meeting area is at the ranch main headquarters on Routt County Road 129. Meeting date and time are established when you make your reservation.
- 7) No overnight camping is allowed on ranch property. Camping areas are available on the nearby Routt National Forest. When you email for reservation, I have a list of the closest accommodations and phone numbers.
- 8) No pre-hunt scouting will be allowed and no dogs allowed on Ranch property.
- 9) No possession or consumption of alcohol, Marijuana, or illegal substances will be allowed on Ranch property.
- 10) No trash or foreign objects will be left on the Ranch.
- 11) Discharging of firearms is not allowed on property except for the direct harvest of the animal you are licensed to hunt. Proper rifle safety practices are mandatory, and negligent discharges will not be tolerated. Please come prepared with rifle sighted and a full box of ammunition.
- 12) All hunters must abide by all state laws and Ranch rules. Violation of state laws, regulations, and/or Ranch Rules may result in expulsion from the ranch, loss of hunting privileges, and possible criminal prosecution. We uphold the highest standards for fair-chase and ethical hunting.
