Not being able to elk hunt because of not gaining permission from a local jurisdiction drawing renders the CPW Elk license useless, just as if no license was granted. It seems reasonable that a preference point be granted because of a useless CPW Elk license, which is the same as not being granted a license at all.

The Big Game brochure for Hunt Code EF-020-L3-R strongly recommends landowner permission before applying.

For the 2020 season, there were no Boulder County Open Space landowner permissions for any hunter before the CPW application deadline.

The 2020 Elk Hunting Statistics have no statistics for EF-20-L3-R. It is not possible to know how many hunters applied for Ron Stewart Preserve at Rabbit Mountain or Red Hill. The number of hunters that successfully drew tags for each Boulder Open Space area are not available and the success percentages are not available.
