Grooming at Spring Creek



Grooming Operations:

- Club is responsible for Grooming 18 miles at Spring Creek Trail System under a special use permit
- 4 volunteers groom up to 12 times per season
- Approximately 85 volunteer hours per year on the snowcat
- Grooming usually occurs in the evening hours
- We groom approximately 10-12 days per year
- The roads we groom are critical in the event of any life/safety issues encountered by local law enforcement and other agencies
- Supported by Search and Rescue
