#692 - Horsethief Canyon SWA Wetlands

Grantee: Ducks Unlimited

#722 - 2022 Continuation and Expansion of Corners for Conservation Playa Buffer Program

Grantee: Pheasants Forever

Description: This project will pay landowners to set aside lands surrounding playa wetlands from agricultural production, and will establish grass buffers around the playas. All tracts will be enrolled in CPW's walk-in access program for public hunting.
