

## **HELPFUL HINTS**

- 3. Take along a camera to photograph species that you can't easily ID in the field.

## **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

Annual – A plant that lives one year

**Biennial** – A plant that lives two years, usually flowering and producing fruit in the 2nd year

**Fern** – an ancient, vascular plant that reproduces by spores

Flower – the reproductive structure of many plants

Forb - A broad- leaved, non-woody plant that dies back to the ground after each growing season

Grass – an annual or perennial herb with a round, hollow stem

Herb - a narrow-leaved, non-woody plant.

Lichen - a composite of an alga and a fungus

Moss - a non-vascular plant; able to dry up and then begin photosynthesis again immediately upon getting water

Perennial - A plant that lives at least three years, usually flowering and producing fruit each year

Shrub - A perennial broad- leaved, woody plant, typically multi-stemmed and less than 15 feet tall

**Succulent** – a plant with fleshy, water-storing stems or leaves

**Tree** – a perennial woody plant with a single stem (trunk), generally at least 15 feet tall


