Park hours change with the seasons and are posted in the park and on our web site.

## Park Passes

All visitors are required to display a valid Colorado State Parks Pass on their vehicle windshield. Revenue from park pass sales is critical to the operation of the park. Passes are available at the park entrance or Visitor Center.

## Photography

The incredible scenery and variety of wildlife make Roxborough a great place to indulge your shutterbug instincts! Photo permits are required for all professional/commercial photography. Remember that you must remain on park trails, even when taking photographs. By rising to this challenge, you will help to ensure that Roxborough is worth photographing in the future.



## Watching Wildlife

Roxborough is an island for wildlife in an area that is rapidly developing and is home to many wildlife species including black bears, mountain lions, bobcats, mule deer, ringtails, and many different raptors including golden eagles. Please respect the animals' need for space while you enjoy watching them. Generally you should be at least 25 yards away from most wildlife and 25-100 yards away from big-game animals. Park staff can provide you with information on viewing wildlife safely and ethically.



## Welcome to Roxborough – Where Plains and Mountains Meet

Roxborough State Park is a Colorado Natural Area, a National Natural Landmark, a National Archeological District, an Audubon Important Bird Area and a Leave No Trace Gold Standard Designated Site.

The park was established to protect the area's unparalleled scenery and resource values while providing opportunities for hiking and learning about Colorado's natural heritage. Roxborough's spectacular geologic setting supports a unique mixture of prairie and mountain species. It is a place of beauty, ecological diversity, and serenity.

## Avoiding the Crowds

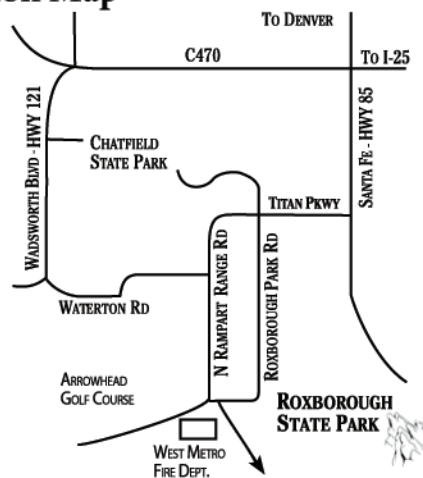

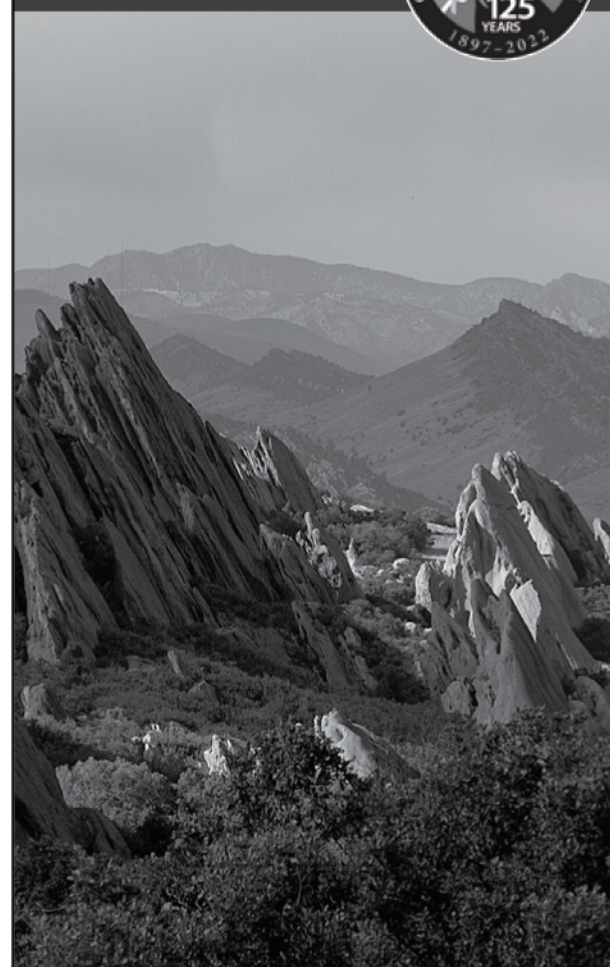

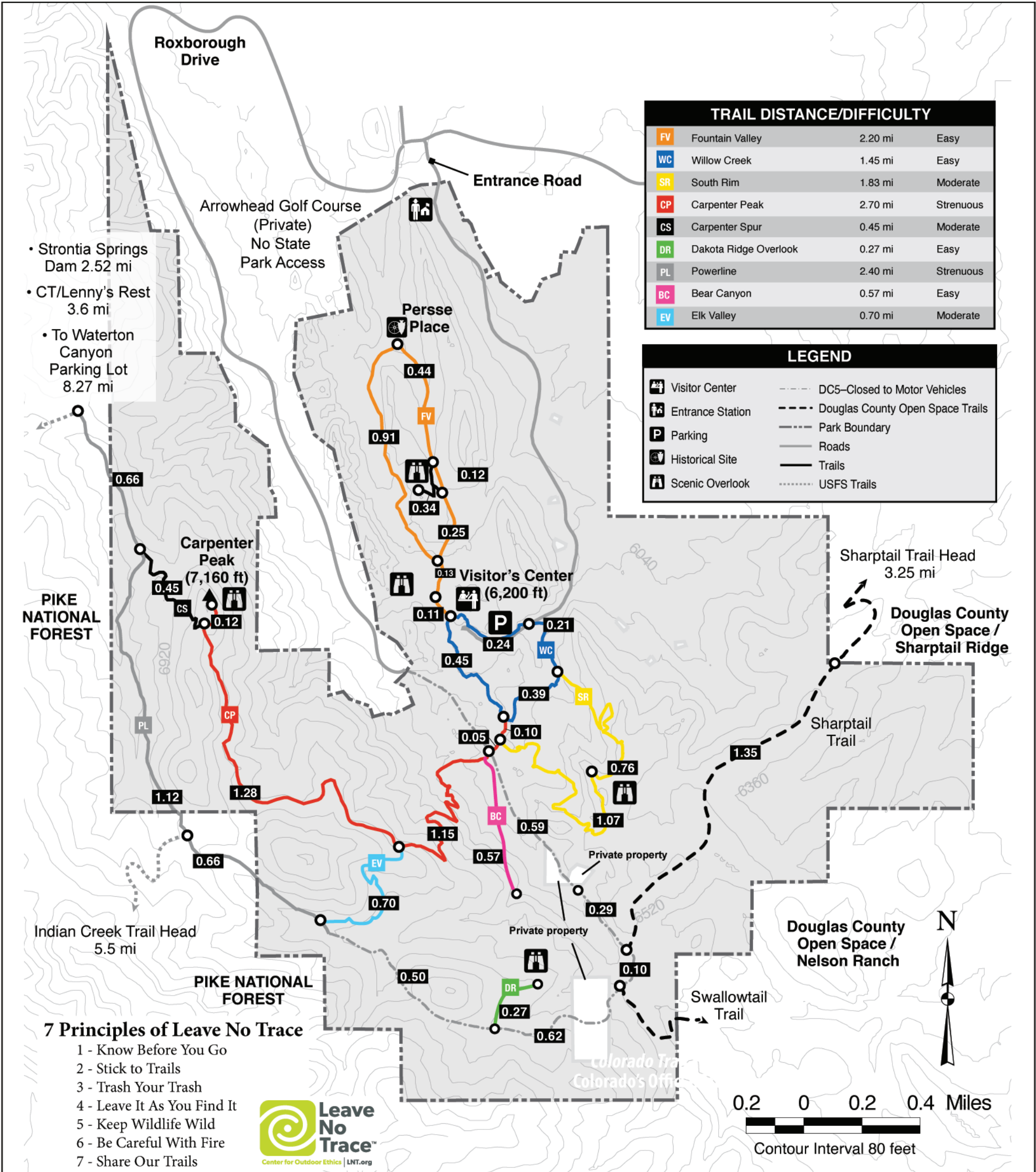


## Friends of Roxborough

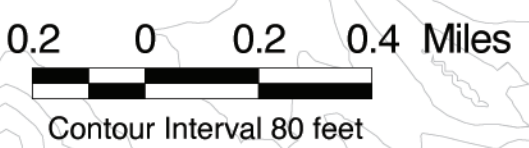

## Park Regulations

- Off-trail travel is prohibited. Hike on designated trails only.
- No pets allowed anywhere in park.
- Rock climbing is prohibited.
- Drones are prohibited.
- Hunting is prohibited.
- Overnight parking is prohibited.
- Day use only. Camping is prohibited.
- Photo permits are required for professional photography.
- All organized groups, events and business activity requires a permit.
- All Colorado Parks and Wildlife laws and regulations apply.
