Who we are

Built solely for recreational use, Sweitzer Lake State Park encompasses a 137-surface acre reservoir. Coined the "oasis on the edge of the desert," Sweitzer has become a popular bird sighting area and a waterfowl observation site. Observers have recorded more than 170 species of birds at the park. A day-use area with no overnight camping, Sweitzer Lake State Park offers sightseeing, picnicking, swimming, boating, water-skiing, fishing and waterfowl hunting.

Top attractions

- The lake's water warms into the high 70s in the summer, making the lake great for swimming.
- The water skiing is excellent, due to the oval shape of the lake.
- There are excellent wildlife viewing and bird watching opportunities.
- In the fall, the lake provides premier waterfowl hunting.



Challenges we face

- The biggest challenge facing Sweitzer Lake State Park is finding the means to address the crumbling infrastructure and overall age of the facility. Much of the infrastructure (water, sewer and irrigation systems) is old and needs frequent repairs. The roads and picnic areas need rehabilitation.
- Expanding the park to bring new activities such as trails and camping also remains a challenge.
