Who we are

Nestled in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains of southern Colorado, Trinidad Lake State Park offers a variety of recreational opportunities and spectacular views of the surrounding mesas and mountains. The park is home to an abundance of wildlife, including fish, birds of prey, coyotes, roadrunners, elk and deer. The lake itself provides for numerous water recreation experiences, such as paddling, sailing, water skiing and excellent fishing. The park also features an archery range, more than 10 miles of hiking, biking and equestrian trails, picnic areas, seasonal hunting opportunities and unusual geologic formations. The Carpios Ridge campground, open year round, serves as a scenic baselocation from which to explore the nearby mountains, Highway of Legends, Santa Fe Trail and historic Trinidad.
