Vega State Park provides outstanding year-round recreation for those interested in “getting away from it all” while maintaining a level of comfort. Located 12 miles east of Collbran, Vega Reservoir sits at 8000’ elevation and serves as the gateway to the Grand Mesa National Forest to the south.

The park is a haven for campers, anglers, boaters and sightseers. During the fall, visitors enjoy hunting, sightseeing and photography. Winter brings snowmobile enthusiasts, ice fishermen, cross-country skiers and snow shoers to the park.

Five rustic cabins await to make your stay an enjoyable one. The cabins are heated by propane stoves and have electric lights and outlets. Each cabin also has a small refrigerator and microwave oven. Outside, each cabin has a picnic table and fire grate. The cabins are easily accessible, and there is a paved parking lot available in front of the cabins. Four-wheeler and snowmobile access is available directly to the Grand Mesa from the cabin parking area.

Vault toilets and water hydrants are centrally located. The camper services building (open May–October) is located in the nearby Early Settlers Campground and provides flush facilities and showers. Firewood may be purchased at the park Visitor Center.



Rental Information

- Each cabin rents for \$90/night.
- Cabins may also be rented over the counter during normal business hours at the Visitor Center at Vega.
- The maximum occupancy is six per cabin.
- Pets are permitted in cabins 1, 2 or 5 for an extra fee of \$10 per night.

Things to Bring

- Cooking gear, utensils and a camp stove
- Food stored in ice chests or boxes
- Warm sleeping bags (visitors are responsible for their own linens), beds are provided
- Warm clothing and boots
- Water containers
- Lighting (supplemental lighting is recommended; i.e. lantern)
- Matches
- Sun protection
- Personal hygiene items

Check-out: noon
- Pets are only allowed in cabins 1, 2 or 5. Please mention your pet when making reservations.
- Keep furniture in its place
- Please leave the cabin as clean as you found it.
